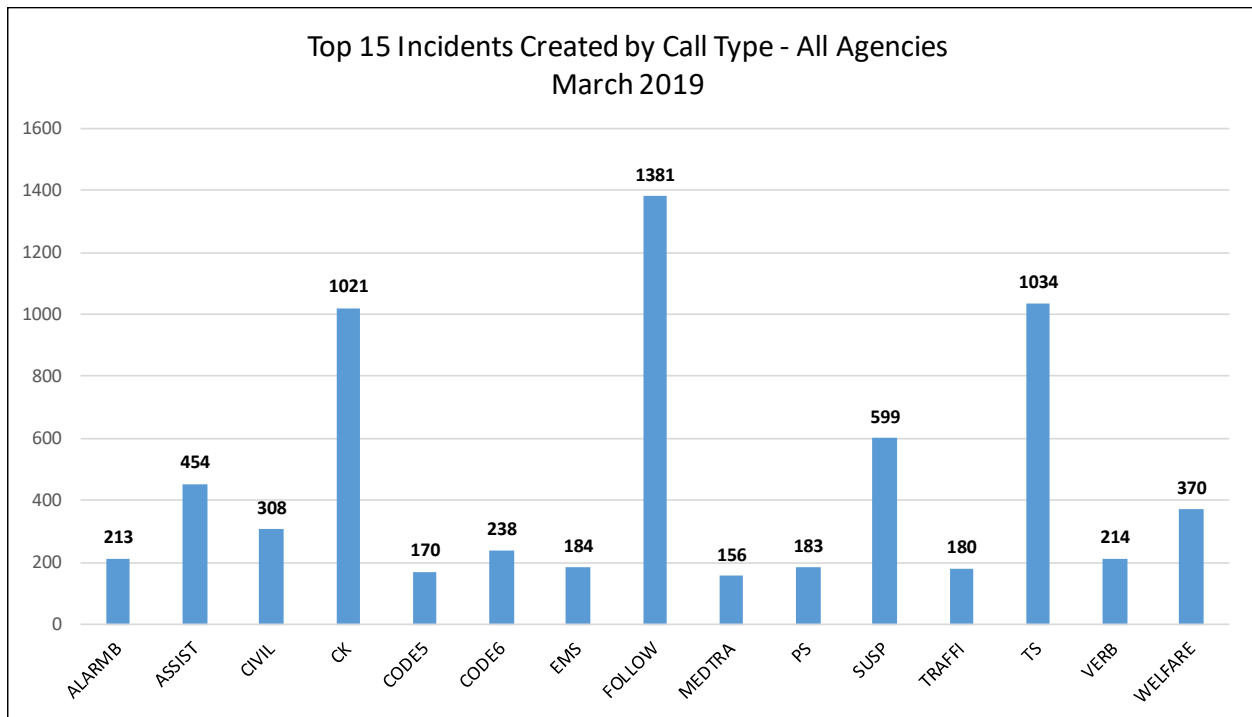

Use of force

3/1/2019 2019-00023 Officer contacted suspect after he was reported to be in a liquor store intoxicated, yelling and being kicked out. The suspect was found to have a warrant for his arrest and when told he was under arrest, he threw down his bike, and took a fighting stance. A second officer was behind the suspect and grab a hold of him and turned him around and he pulled away while attempting to handcuff him. The suspect was taken to the ground and continued to resist and was given knee strikes and ultimately handcuffed.

3/3/2019 2019-00029 Officers responded to a male subject with a knife making threats to other customers. The suspect was identified upon arrival and a silver object was observed in his hands. He was given repeated commands to keep his hands up, but refused and kept reaching into his pockets. Officer with a K-9 arrived and continued to give commands to keep his hands up and he refused. The K-9 was given the bite command and the suspect was pushed with the K-9's muzzle, but did not bite him, he was then pulled to the ground by the officer at which time he stuck his hands, knees and head on the pavement causing him injury. He was taken into custody.
