I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 1:59 p.m. Those present were Hearing Officer Sam Starritt, City Attorney John Shaver and Deputy City Clerk Selestina Sandoval.

II. APPLICATION TO RENEW LIQUOR AND BEER LICENSE

Hearing Office Starritt agreed with the City's findings and signed the Stipulation, Agreement and Order for Redlands Liquor.

City of Grand Junction Parks and Recreation Supervisor Larry Manchester answered a series of questions regarding the event location, security, and how it will be conducted lawfully.

Hearing Officer Starritt asked if anyone present was in opposition of this special event permit being issued. There was no one. Hearing Officer Starritt entered Exhibits "A" and "B" (attached) into the record.

Hearing Officer Starritt found that pursuant to Colorado State Statute 44-5-106, there are no grounds to deny the special event permit; it would not be injurious to the public welfare because of the nature of the special event, its location within the community, or the failure of the applicant in a past special event to conduct the event in compliance with applicable laws. The application for a special event permit submitted by the City of Grand Junction for "Chrome & Brews Car Show – 2019" was in order and approved.

1. Name of Event: Chrome and Brews Car Show

2. How many attendees are expected at the event? 2000

5. Describe the premises at which the event will take place.
Alcohol consumption will take place in area south of Lincoln Park Barn as shown in diagram attached.

6. What type of and how many security will be provided at this event and how will they be identified?
Hired security as well as city staff.

7. What is the Control Plan for security at this event? (Use additional sheet if necessary)
We will fence off the licensed area, and have city staff as well as paid security selling and monitoring consumption of the alcohol. We will be ID checking and wrist banding all participants who are of age and wish to consume the alcohol. We will station paid security at ID station as well as entrance/exit.

8. How will security personnel be identified?
4 paid security and 8 city staff

9. If this event is being held outdoors, how will the exterior boundaries of the premises be marked (i.e., roped, fenced, etc.)?
The boundaries will be fenced of with snow fencing.

10. What method will be used in checking identification for proper age of attendees (i.e., at the door, at the bar, etc.) and how will underage patrons be identified so as not to be served alcohol beverages (i.e., stamp or mark on the hand, etc.)

All servers have been trained in id checking through city liquor training, and anyone buying or consuming alcohol will be wrist banded. Anyone purchasing will be check to assure they are over 21.

11. How will the conduct and level of intoxication of attendees be monitored and by whom?

Conduct and levels will be monitored and controlled by both trained city staff and the security staff as they have been trained to do so by our safe server training.

12. Have the volunteers or members of your organization been trained in the sale/service of alcohol beverages?

Yes, through either the city alcohol training or TIPS training.


13. What types of alternate beverages and food/snacks will be available?

Will have vendors selling soda, water, and full menu of festival food.

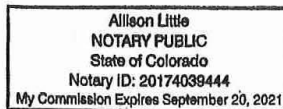

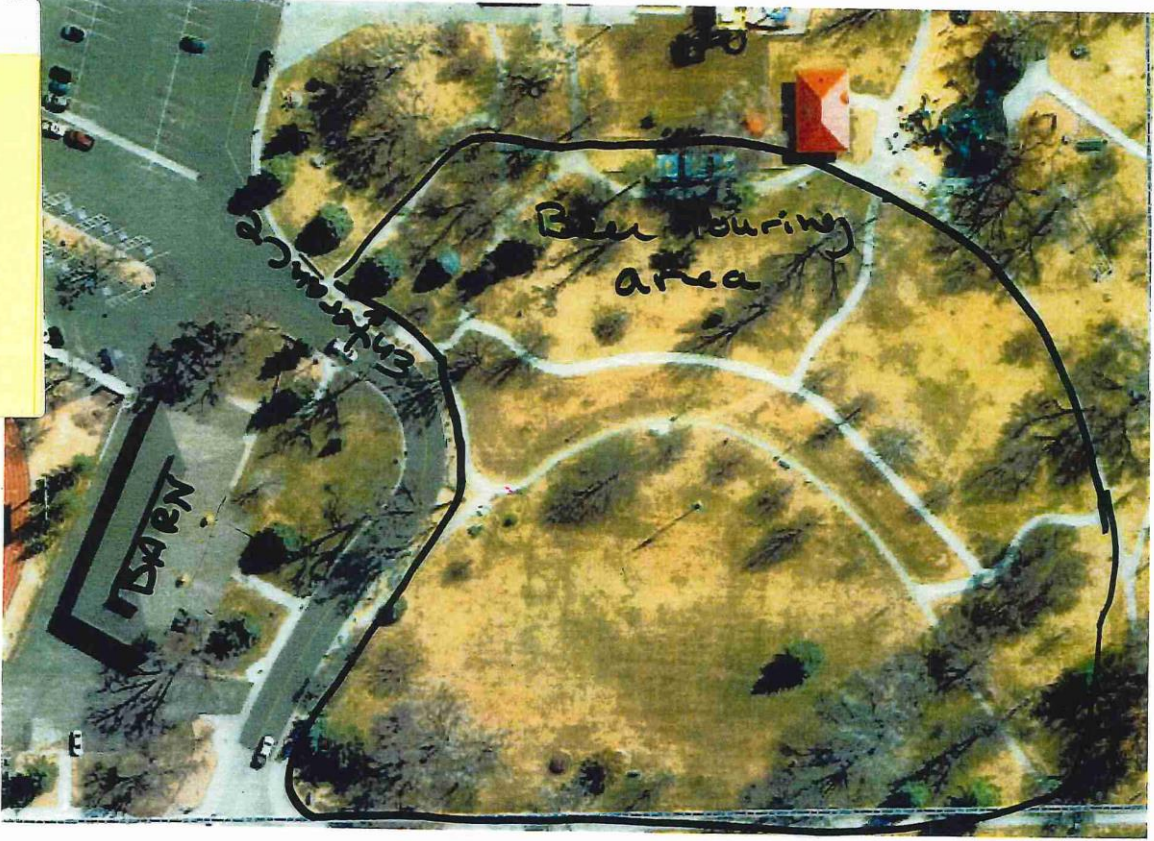
