I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 2:02 p.m. Those present were Hearing Officer Sam Starritt, City Attorney John Shaver and Deputy City Clerk Janet Harrell.

Renewal applications #1 through #7 were approved and application #8 was conditionally approved.

tarmac of the GJ Regional Airport and West Star Aviation, Venue will be fenced and crowds will enter and exit through gates staffed by security.

6. What type of and how many security will be provided at this event and how will they be identified?
5D Shield security has been contracted, they will provide armed and unarmed security, bag checks and event security. In addition the GJ Police will have a presence. Commander Baker will be on site.

Air show organizational chart is attached, Contract with 5D Shield is attached
We will perform a training session for volunteers prior to their work. Red Frog is the vendor and they have contracted with us the last 2 shows and have done a good job of monitoring the liquor sales and distribution. We will have over 21 bands for those that wish to drink. In addition, ID's will be checked at each sale of liquor.

uniformed security staff

There will be fencing or physical structures on all sides

Point of sales will be staffed by trained staff and patrons will be check at the point of sale for age

All alcoholic beverage handlers will be trained servers. Local liquor servers will be contracted for VIP point of sale. Red Frog Food and Beverage has been contracted for general sales

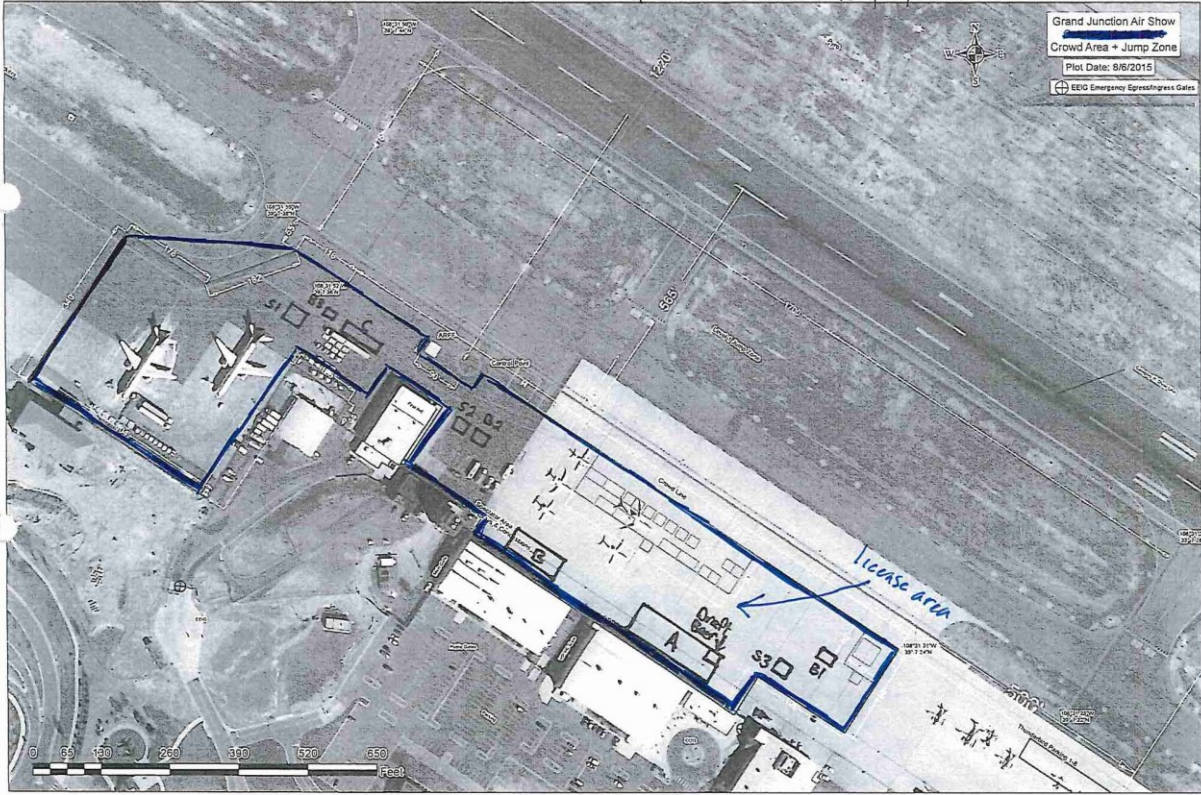

422 White Ave, the property is a mix of lawn + parking lot. Property will be fenced except entrance/exits. Security will be 24 hrs. a day.

6. What type of and how many security will be provided at this event and how will they be identified?
A mix of volunteer, staff, + uniformed security. Volunteers + Staff will have t-shirts + or name badges.

7. What is the Control Plan for security at this event? (Use additional sheet if necessary)
A uniformed guard will be placed at each of the 2 entrance/exit gates, 2 guards will also roam the festival grounds. Approximately 6 volunteers will roam the festival daily. Approximately 7-9 CWP Staff will also be roaming the festival grounds daily.

8. How will security personnel be identified?
Uniformed officers + volunteer / staff t-shirts.

9. If this event is being held outdoors, how will the exterior boundaries of the premises be marked (i.e., roped, fenced, etc.)?
Boundaries of the festival will be fenced.

10. What method will be used in checking identification for proper age of attendees (i.e., at the door, at the bar, etc.) and how will underage patrons be identified so as not to be served alcohol beverages (i.e., stamp or mark on the hand, etc.)

Attendees will be ID'd @ the bar lines + wrist banded. Patrons must have a wristband to purchase alcohol.

Security, Staff, & volunteers will look for signs of intoxication.

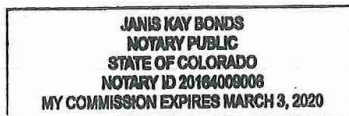
