All patrons will be ID'd and identified at both controlled points of entry. Additional security will monitor participant behavior and to prevent participatns form becoming noticeably intoxicated. Any person who is noticeably intoxicated will not be served. GJPD will be called if any illegal activity or behavior occurs that cannot be controlled by security. Last call will be at 5:00 p.m. The licensed area will be swept prior to 6:00 pm to ensure that all alcohol is consumed prior to that time.

8. How will security personnel be identified?

Orange vests.

9. If this event is being held outdoors, how will the exterior boundaries of the premises be marked (i.e., roped, fenced, etc.)?

The premises will be marked by control fencing with 2 controlled entry/exit points.
