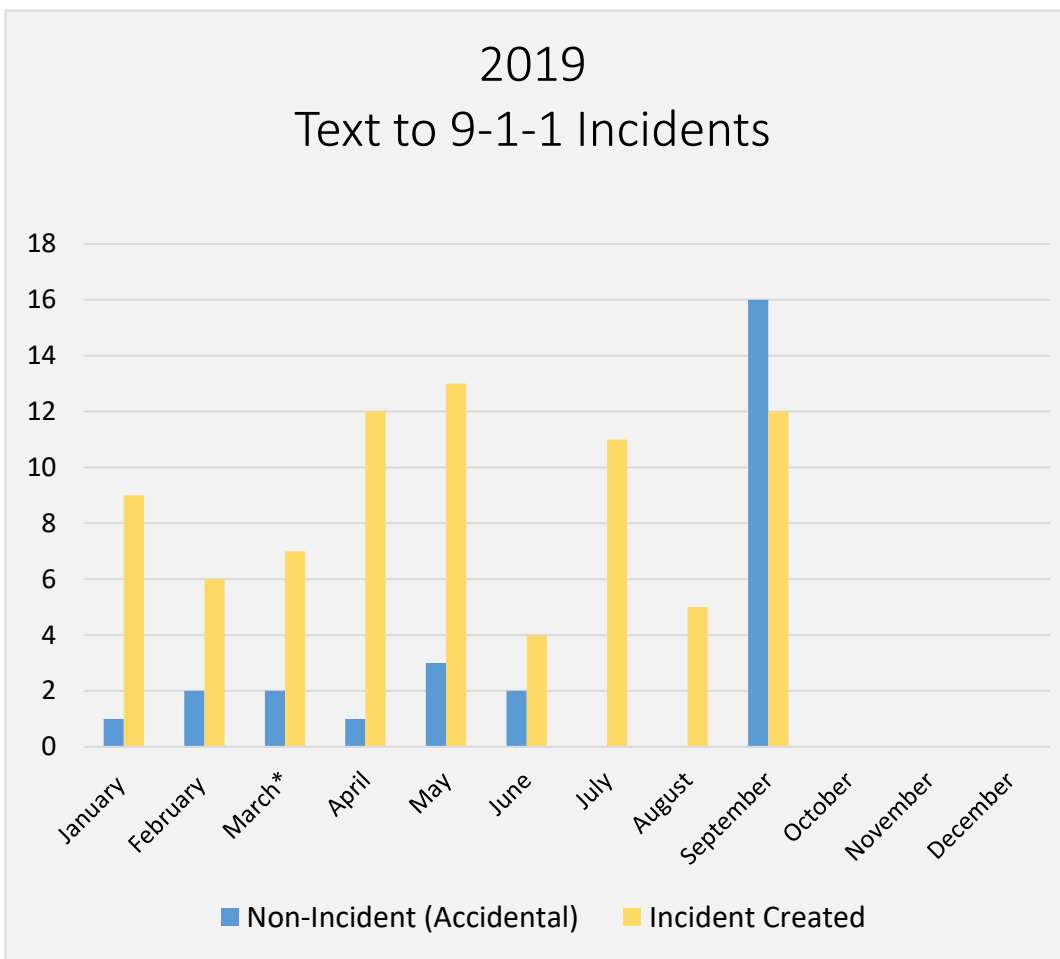


**Dispatch Console Workload

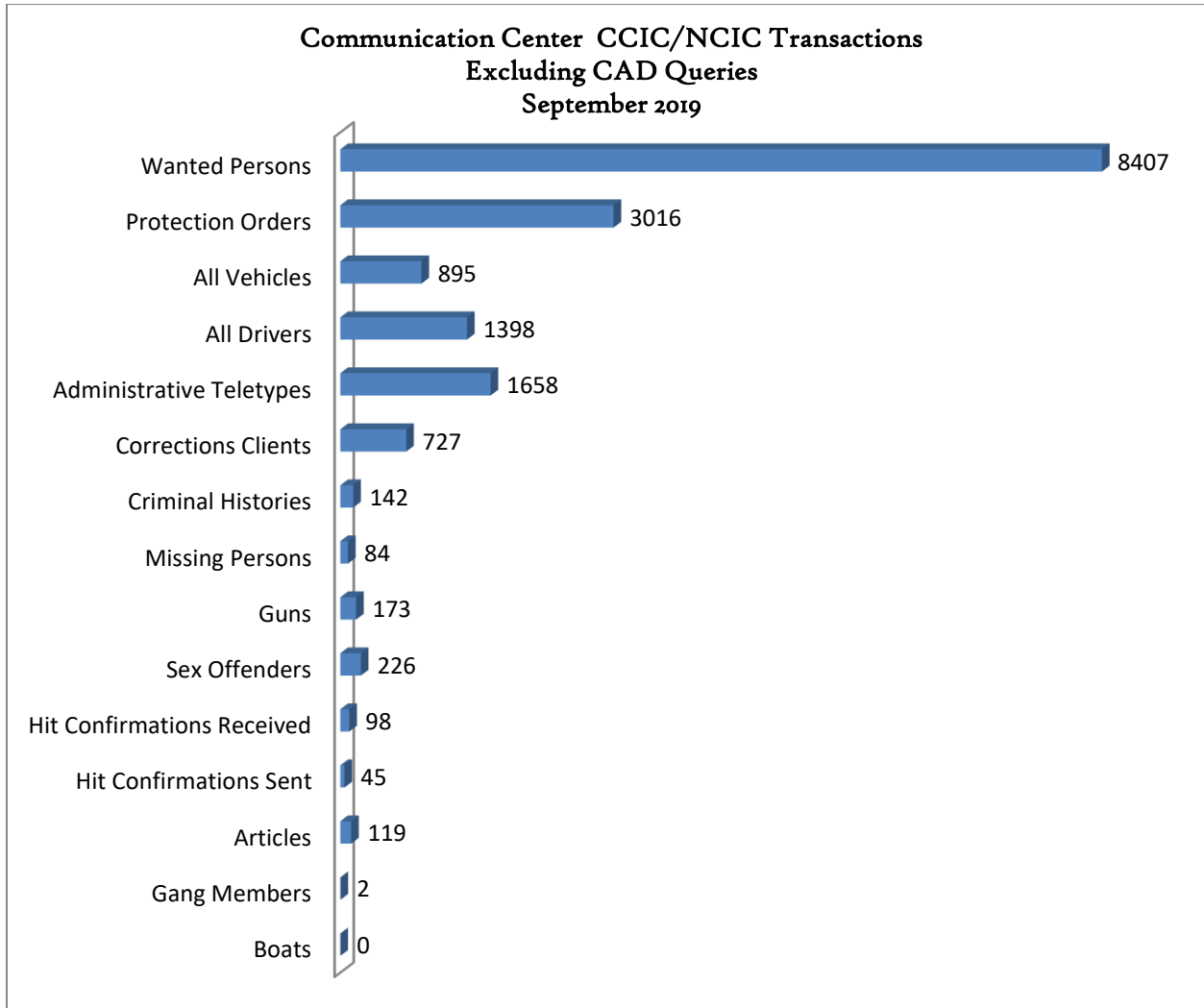


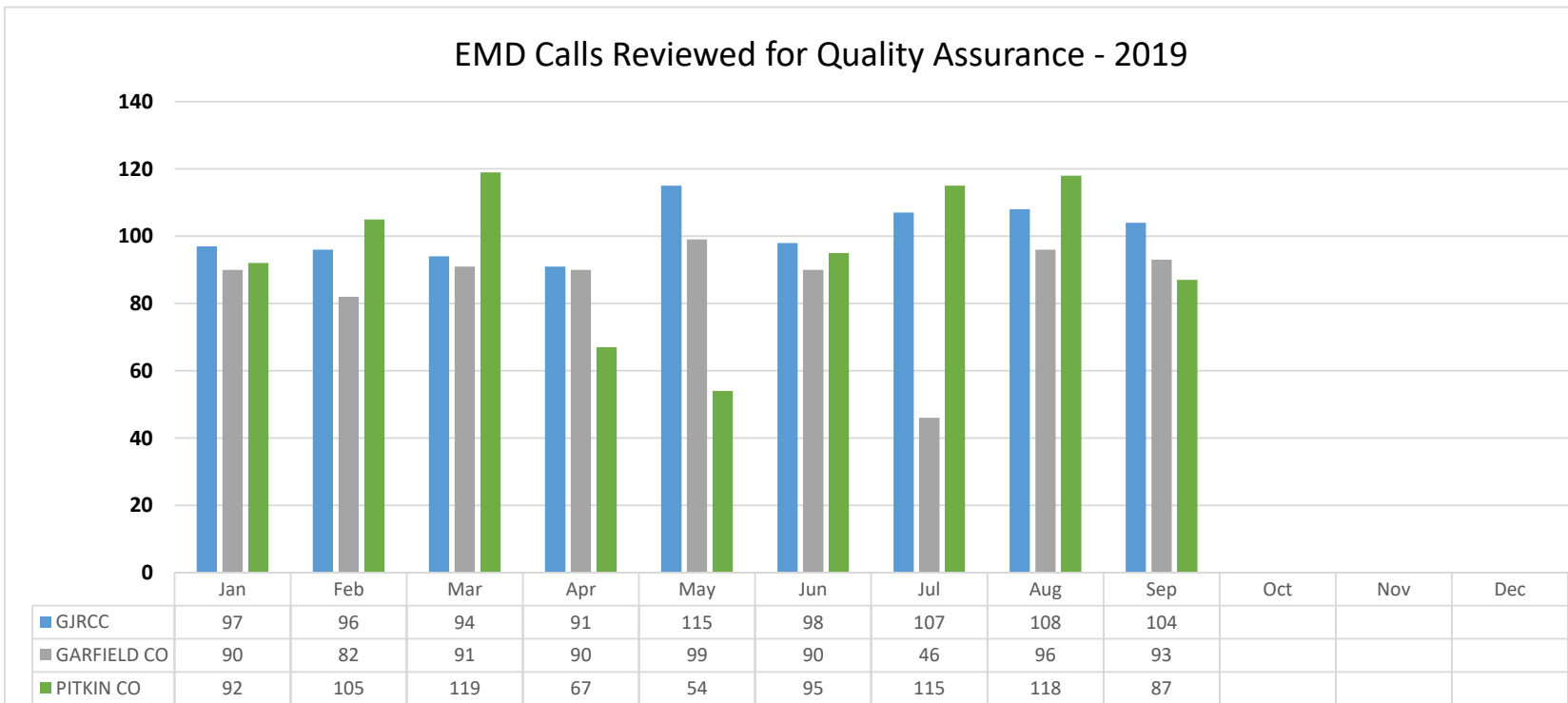
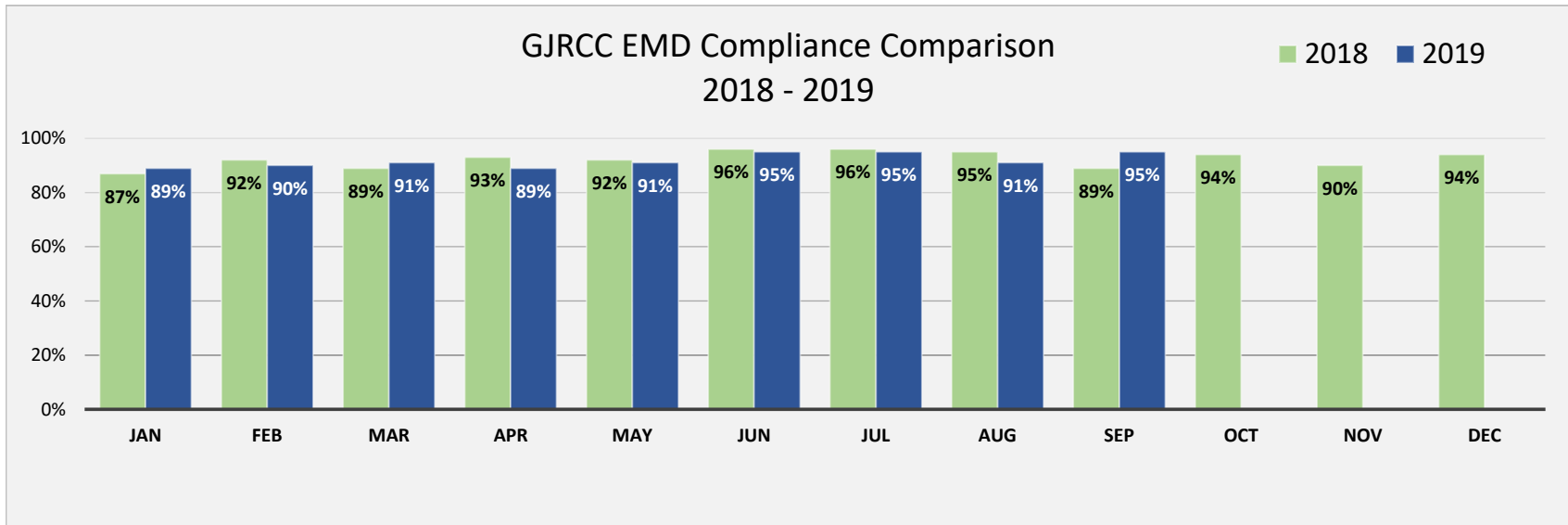
