

MINUTES OF THE GRAND JUNCTION COMMISSION ON ARTS AND CULTURE  
MAY 12 1993

The regular monthly meeting of the Grand Junction Commission on Arts and Culture was called to order by Chair Sandra Brown at 7:05 May 12, 1993 in City Hall Conference Room "A".

Commissioners present: Andrews, Brown, Castleberry, Freitas, Leinaweaver and Smedley

Commissioners absent: Crumbacher, Hemmerich and Sanders.

Guest present: Allison Sarmo

Minutes of the previous meeting were not available for approval.

REPORTS:

Agenda was amended to include "Dog and Pony Show" for Rotary meeting of 16 June. Castleberry and Sarmo reported on progress of the Dog and Pony Show which would be available to interested groups. There was discussion of multi-media presentations. Leinaweaver/Castleberry moved and seconded to authorize up to \$150 for materials and services . Passed.

Local Arts & Education folders are "making progress". Brenda will be asked to have a draft for next meeting.

Leinaweaver reported that THE FROG PRINCE has been cast and rehearsals are underway. He submitted a revised budget breakdown to the Chair, and stated that the principal need now is someone to handle promotion and publicity and to manage the front of the house during performances June 11, 12, and 13. Brown and Freitas volunteered to cover the House Management. Brown suggested that the Avalon committee be contacted to do publicity.

Castleberry reported 16 attendees including featured speakers at the Colorado Consortium of Arts Commissions meeting last month. The main topic was the Americans disability Act and access to the arts. The next meeting is Sept 17-19 in Alamosa.

Smedley reported that the application for the September Business in Art Workshop was turned down. The workshops will still happen, but will be reduced in number.

Andrews and Leinaweaver submitted a wrtitten report on performance facilities, which the commission accepted.

The draft of a letter to District 51 re appreciation of no arts included in recent budget cuts was submitted by Leinaweaver and approved.

NEW BUSINESS

Brown distributed a summary worksheet based on Retreat priorities, and asked members to come to next meeting with budget proposals for inclusion in 1993, '94 and '95 budget.

Meeting adjourned at 9:10.
