### MINUTES WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 18, 2019, 2:00 P.M.

#### HEARING OFFICER SAM D. STARRITT

#### I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m. Those present were Hearing Officer Sam Starritt, City Attorney John Shaver and Deputy City Clerk Selestina Sandoval.

Hearing Officer Starritt verified the applications were in order and asked if anyone was present to speak against them. There was no one. The applications to renew and change in corporate structure were approved.

Present for the applicant were El Balsante, Inc. President Antonio Amador and Oedipus, Inc. Owner/Operator Max Scott whose company conducted the needs and desires survey.

Ms. Sandoval reported the paperwork is in order and read the survey results (attached).

Mr. Scott answered a series of questions on how the survey was conducted.

Hearing Officer Starritt asked if anyone would like to speak against the application. There was no one. He then said, based on the information presented, there is no evidence that the application would not meet the needs and desires of the neighborhood and approved the application pending final inspections by the Mesa County Health Department and the Grand Junction Fire Department.

CMU Director of Alumni Relations Jared Meier answered a series of questions regarding the event location, security and how it will be conducted lawfully.

Hearing Officer Starritt asked if anyone present was in opposition of this special event permit being issued. There was no one. Hearing Officer Starritt entered Exhibits "A" and "B" (attached) into the record.

Hearing Officer Starritt found that pursuant to Colorado State Statute 44-5-106, there are no grounds to deny the special event permit; it would not be injurious to the public welfare because of the nature of the special event, its location within the community, or the failure of the applicant in a past special event to conduct the event in compliance with applicable laws. The application for a special event permit submitted by CMU Foundation for the "Valentine's Dinner - 2020" was in order and approved.

A liquor license change of location application to 624 Rae Lynn Street, Unit C, Grand Junction, CO 81505, permitting sales of malt, vinous and spirituous liquors for sale by the drink at place where sold, was filed with the Local Licensing Authority on October 24, 2019 with a "Notice of Hearing" posted on the property on or before noon on December 3, 2019 and a legal notice published in the Daily Sentinel on December 4, 2019.

A survey was conducted by Oedipus, Inc. (results attached) to address the reasonable requirements of the neighborhood. The neighborhood was defined as the area bounded by G Road on the north, River Road on the south, 25 Road on the east, and 23 ½ Road on the west, and includes both sides of the outer boundary streets. The City Clerk's Office reviewed the findings by Oedipus, Inc. and obtained the following results (map attached).

FAVOR: 48 OPPOSE: 0

FAVOR: 145 OPPOSE: 2

Five responses were disqualified for the following reasons: incomplete entry (1), address not verified (1), not age 21 or over (2) and not a business owner/manager (1).

To date, no letters of opposition or counter petitions have been filed.

The Grand Junction Police Department will investigate the individuals for local criminal history. Reports have also been requested from the City of Grand Junction Sales Tax Department, the Fire Department, and Mesa County Health Department.



entering. Once attendees are seated for the dinner trained Viticulture faculty will be serving wine with each
course, to attendees who are not marked on both hands. The Citadel officer will be positioned at the single
entrance and exit point throughout the event to ensure no alcohol leaves or enters the premise. The
uniformed security officer as well as trained staff will monitor intoxication and conduct. These staff
members are Tips or safe server trained.
8. How will security personnel be identified?
They will be in uniform. Staff will be in recognizable shirts.
9. If this event is being held outdoors, how will the exterior boundaries of the premises be marked (i.e., roped, fenced, etc.)?


