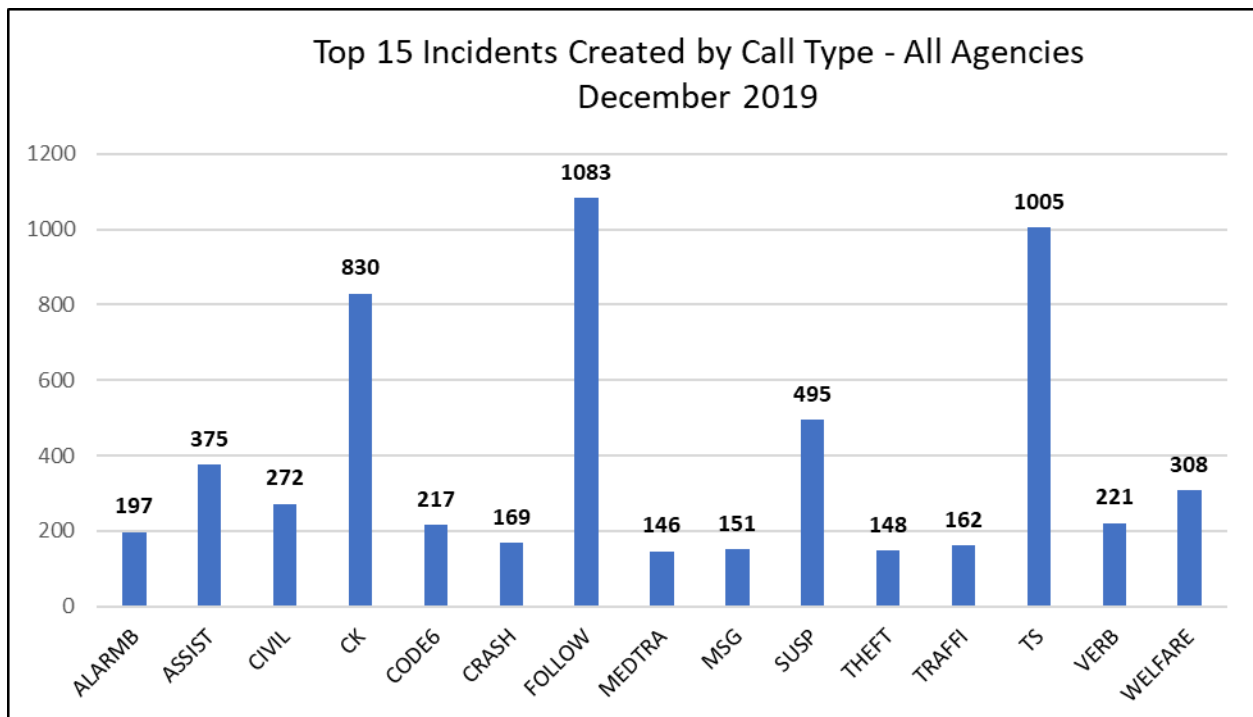

Zack said he didn't think officers got enough compliments so he called in to thank them.

I was on the call with Ofc. Hagerman, the primary, Ofc. DeBellevue and Ofc. Holtz and they all did a good job. The incident involved a family who had concerns over how their elderly mother with dementia was being taken care of. There was a lot of emotion and the family members were in opposition of each other. Ofc. Hagerman did a good job explaining we had no authority to enforce anything, but we were there to help and try to do some mediation. The family was given some suggestions and help and Zack said things worked out fine and his grandmother was home in Arizona safely.

I commend the officers for using restraint, good judgement and effective communication tempered with empathy for the family situation.
