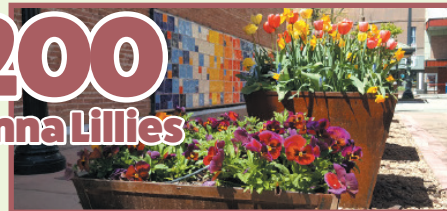

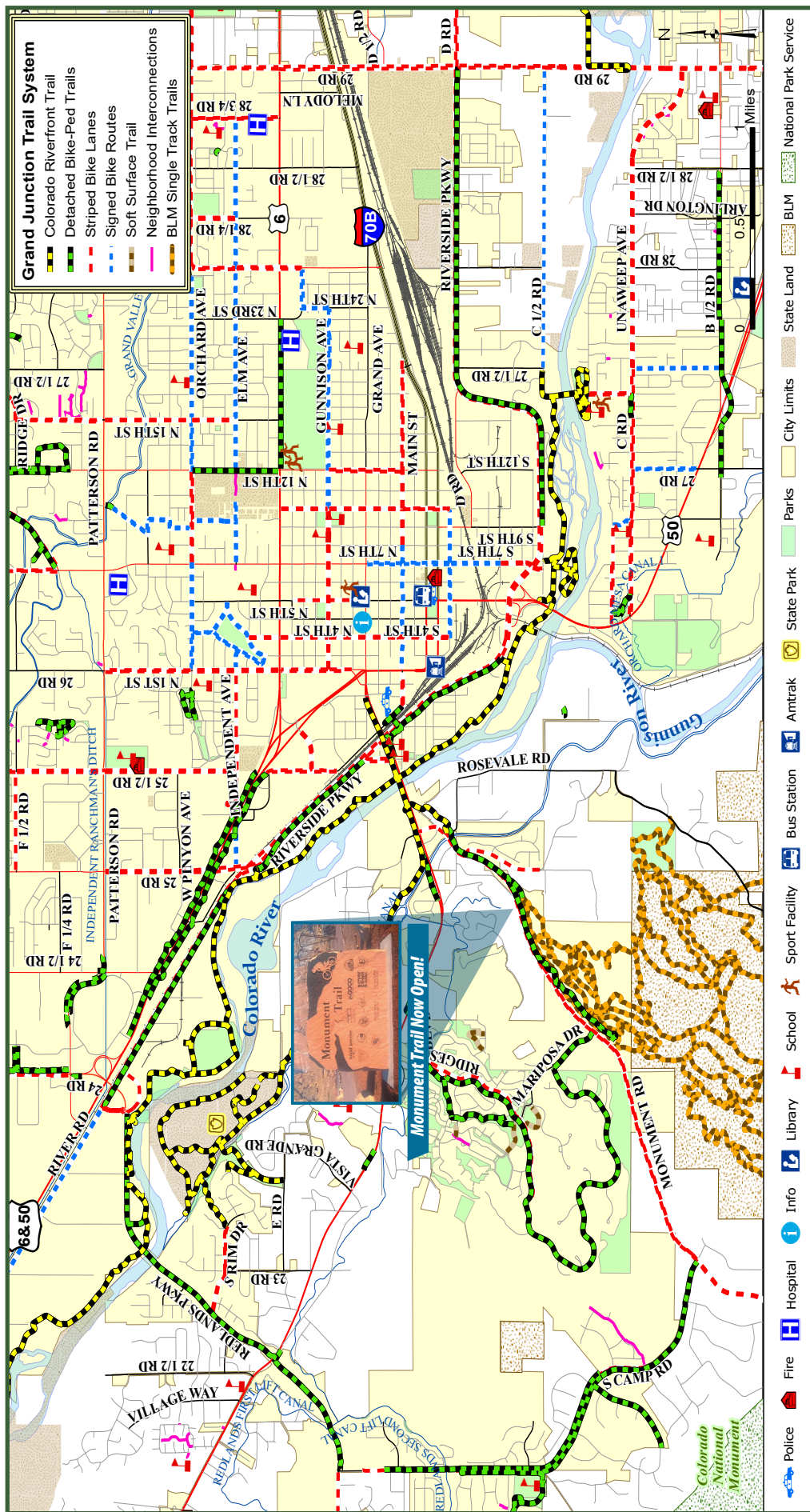

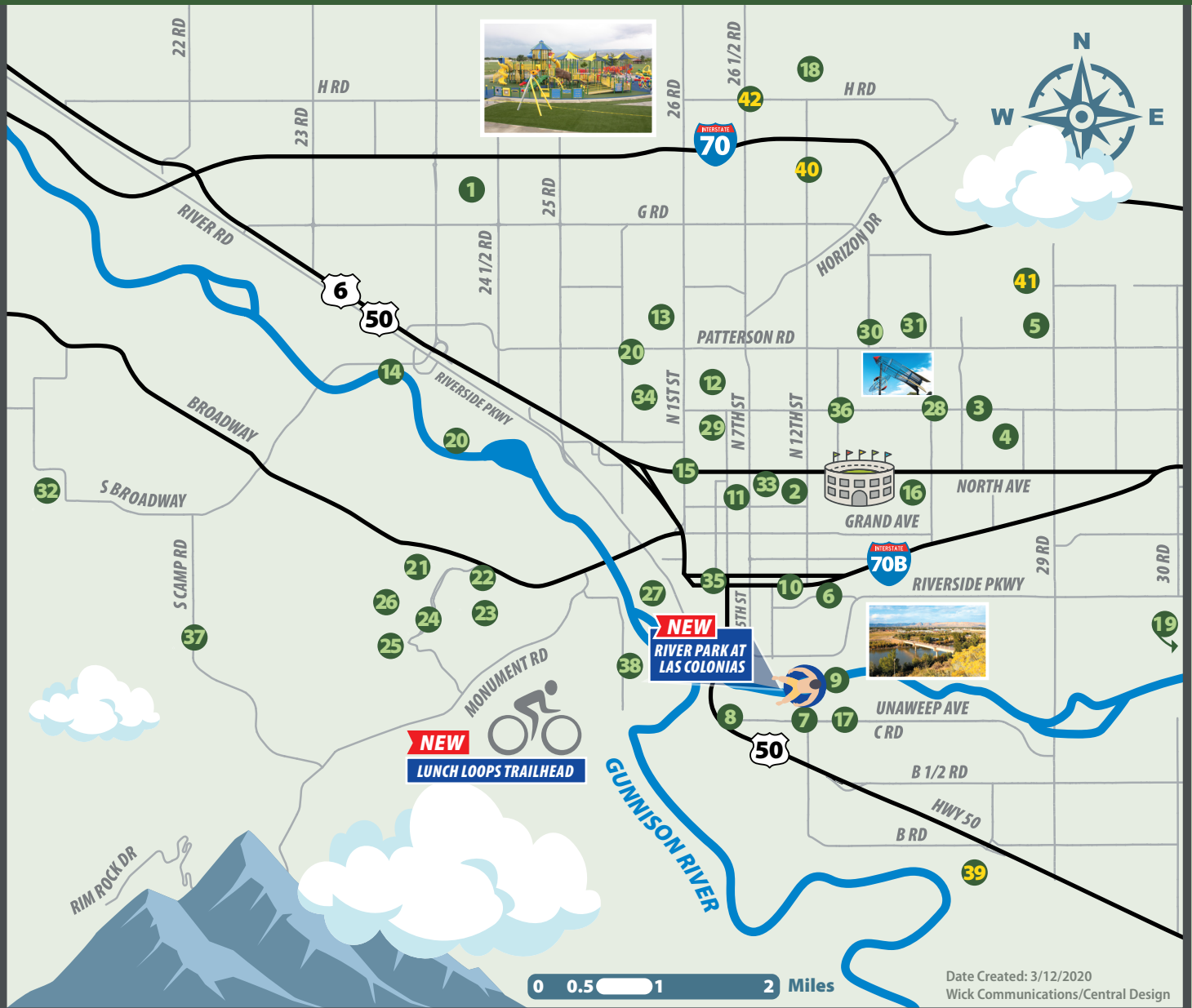
Grand Junction Bicycle and Pedestrian Trail System

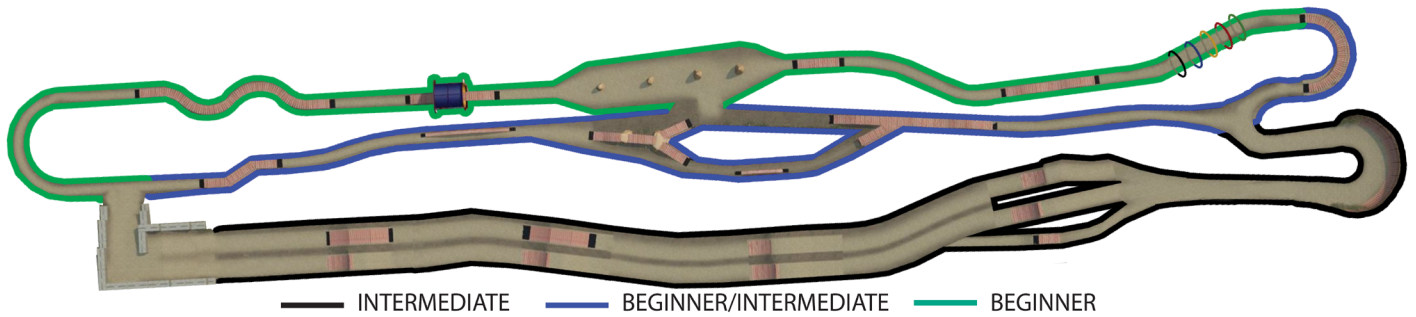

BIKE PARK RULES AND ETIQUETTE

SAFETY FIRST

- Helmets, body armor and protective gear is encouraged.
- Pedestrians must stay off trails and features except as assisting younger riders. Stay visible to avoid an accident.
- Safety check your bike and gear before riding.
- Conditions change constantly so always inspect where you are riding.
- No building or modifying trails and features.

GENERAL RULES

- This Park is open from dawn to dusk.
- All City parks/facilities are smoke free, including tobacco, marijuana and electronic smoking devices (vaping).
- Glass containers and vandalism is prohibited.
- Keep the park clean and litter-free. Carry out all your belongings. Please leave no trace.
- No firearms of any kind.
- Permits for are required for commercial use, including tours, classes, camps or films. Call 970-254-3866 for detail.
- Do not approach, follow, or feed wildlife.

RIDING TRAILS

- BIKES ONLY.
- No Scooters, skateboards or motorized vehicles.
- Stay on trails and don't skid out.
- Keep off closed trails.

RIDING JUMPS AND FEATURES

- Ride within your abilities. Progress slowly.
- Keep to one rider at a time and ALWAYS look before you jump.
- Clear landing areas quickly to avoid an accident.

BE COURTEOUS

- Call out when passing.
- Be helpful to less experienced riders.
- Yield to pedestrians and other riders.

USE FACILITY AT YOUR OWN RISK

- Riding here is hazardous; if you are here you assume the risk.
- Children 8 years old and under should be accompanied by an adult.

The City of Grand Junction is looking for residents who want to make their neighborhoods greener. If you live in Grand Junction, have an open, plantable space along your street right-of-way, and are committed to providing a newly planted tree the water it needs, we want to give you a tree. With a limited number of trees available, residents are encouraged to act quickly by contacting the City Forester (robd@gjcity.org) for more information on the program.

Balancing healthy tree canopy and water conservation

Don't forget to save your shade by focusing added attention towards the water needs of your trees. Prolonged dry periods and high winds can dry trees and soil, and watering your trees will help ensure their optimum health. In non-irrigated areas, it is recommended to water small trees four times per month, medium trees three times per month, and large trees two times per month.

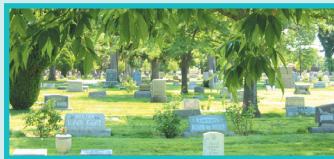

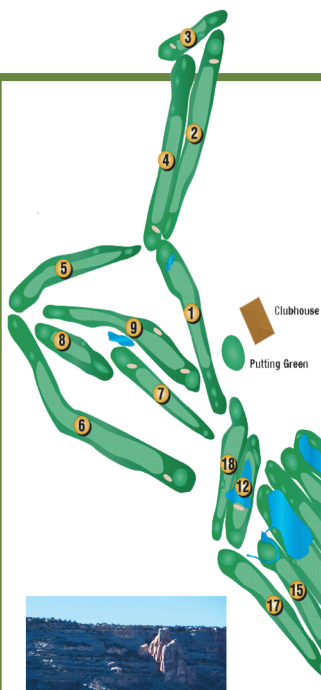

The Grand Junction Commission on Arts and Culture

was formed in 1990 as an advisory board to the Grand Junction City Council regarding priorities for public expenditure and development of art and culture in Grand Junction. Established by the Art Commission in 1991, the Grand Junction Strategic Cultural Plan guides the community in its cultural priorities and maintains the vision of Grand Junction as a cultural mecca. Public art enhances the quality of life in a community and the Art Commission is involved every step of the way. From roundabouts to street corners, to art in the parks, to art in the Downtown and murals along the Riverfront, the Art Commission assists in selection and maintenance of the artwork. The Art Commission supports the belief that the creative industries should thrive in our valley. They provide free rotating exhibit space to over 100 Mesa County artists every year in public City facilities. The Art Commission hosts several projects including Take Part in Art, Champion of the Arts and Write On! The Commission also manages a grant program available to non-profit arts organizations.

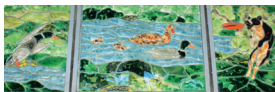

Park Rules and Regulations

Thank You for Visiting City of Grand Junction Parks

To help make everyone's visit a positive experience, please be mindful of the following park rules and regulations.

- Parks are open from 5:00 AM to 10:00 PM (Hours may vary at specific parks)
- All city parks are smoke free facilities, including tobacco, marijuana, and substances delivered through electronic smoking devices (vaping)
- Glass containers are prohibited
- Possession/consumption of beer and wine is allowed (except at Hawthorn or Emerson, unless a permit is obtained)
- Pets must be leashed at all times and waste cleaned up.
- Paid reservations have priority; other uses are first come, first served
- Golfing is prohibited
- Preauthorization of any commercial sales is required

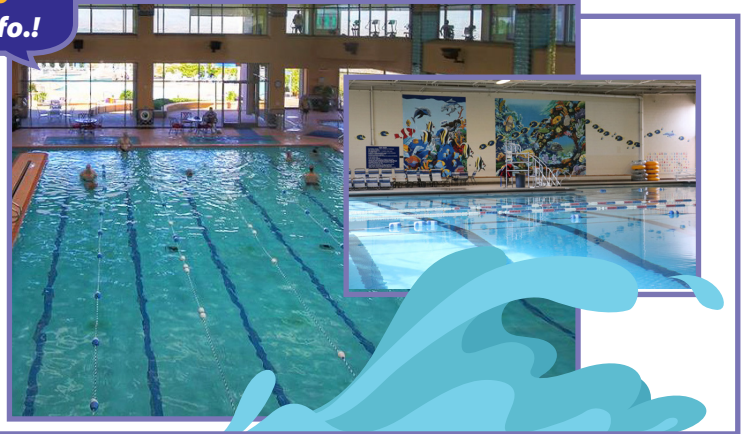

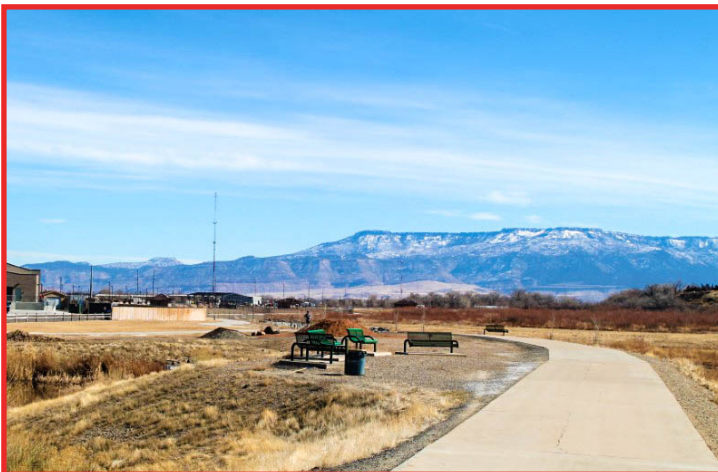

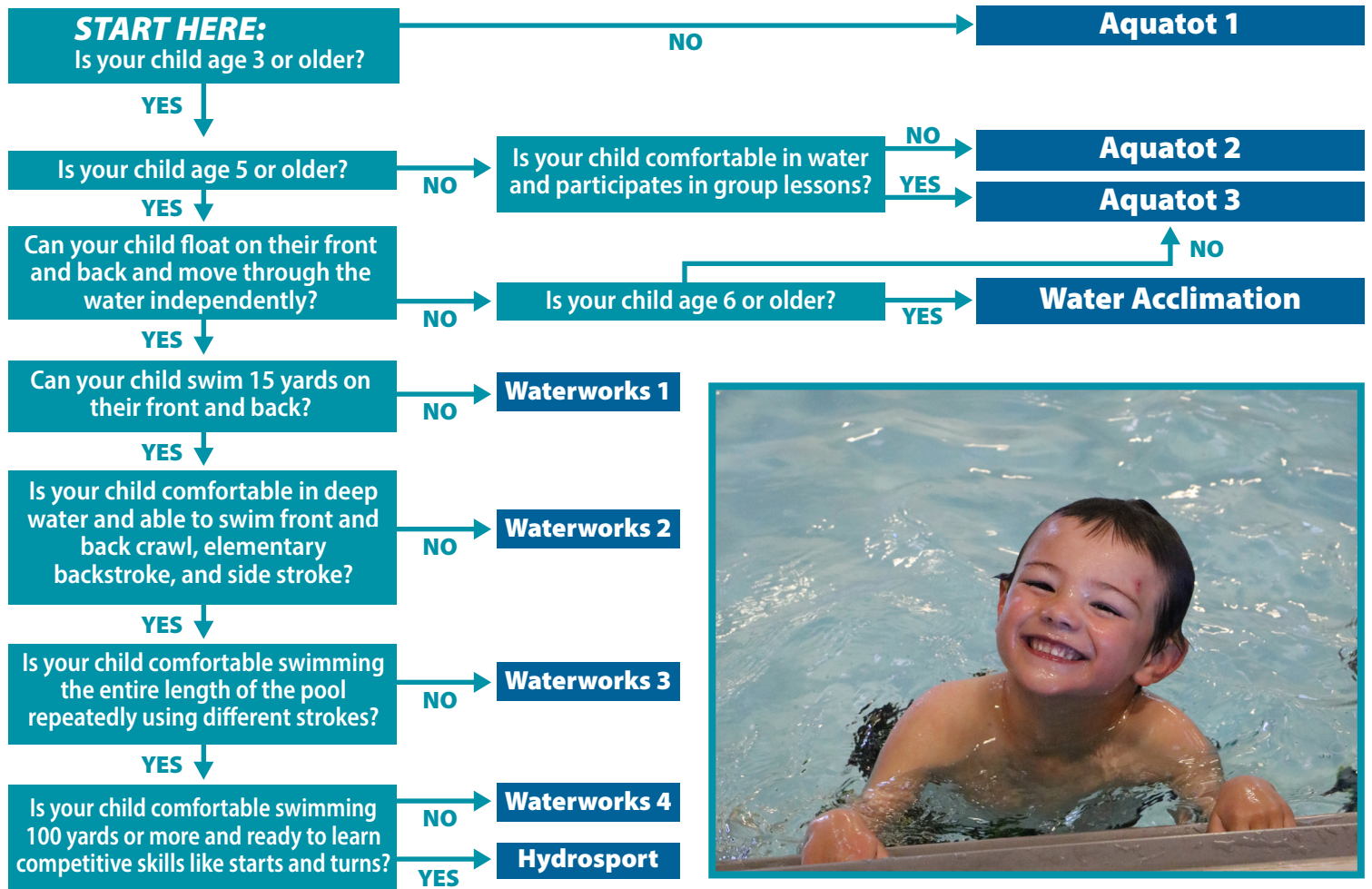

ORCHARD MESA POOL COVID-19 POLICIES

- Pool capacity is limited to 160 people. All guests are required to pay admission. PLEASE NOTE: capacity may change with MCPH guidelines.
- In the event capacity is reached, guests will be limited to two hours of swim time. Guests are welcome to get back in line and re-enter at no additional fee.
- Please remain six feet from non-family members at all times.
- Swim aides (kickboards, fins, buoys, etc.) will not be available. Please provide your own if needed.
- Facility-provided lifejackets will be sanitized after each use. A limited numbers of lifejackets are available and guests are encouraged to bring their own US Coast Guard-approved lifejackets.
- Deck furniture will be sanitized after each use. Available deck furniture has been minimized to encourage physical distancing. Guests are prohibited from moving furniture.
- Children under age eight must be accompanied by an attentive, responsible adult.
- Lockers, changing rooms, and stalls are closed. Swimmers should arrive swim-ready and leave directly from the pool. Personal items must be brought to the pool deck, and valuable items should be left at home.
- Guests must follow signage designating one-way travel through high-traffic areas.
