Whereas, December 7, 2020 marks the 79th Anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor; and

Phereas, on December 7, 1941, without warning and minutes before 8:00 a.m., aircraft of the Imperial Japanese Navy and Air Force attacked United States military installations at Pearl Harbor and elsewhere on the Island of Oahu, Hawaii; and

Phereas, 2,403 members of the United States Armed Forces were killed or mortally wounded, 1,247 members of the Armed Forces were wounded, and 57 civilians lost their lives; and the bulk of the attack at Pearl Harbor lasted for approximately five hours, during which

Bhereas, date which will live in infamy," and Americans became united in remembrance of their fallen countrymen and committed to defending the United States against all aggressors: President Franklin Delano Roosevelt declared the day of the attack on Pearl Harbor,
