Resources for Employees on COVID-19 Testing

- **PCR Testing** (A PCR test, also called a molecular test or polymerase chain reaction test, detects genetic material specific to the virus that causes COVID-19. PCR testing is considered the "gold standard" in COVID-19 detection and is often more accurate than a rapid test, especially in individuals without symptoms.)

- **Rapid Testing** (also called an Antigen Test). This test detects protein fragments specific to the Coronavirus. It can be done at home, in a clinic, doctor's office, or hospital. Turnaround time for results is usually very quick and, in some cases, results can be reported within 15 minutes.

 - A limited number of free rapid tests are available each day and should be used by those patients experiencing COVID-19 symptoms.
