CONTRACT

This CONTRACT made and entered into this 6th day of January, 2023 by and between the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, a government entity in the County of Mesa, State of Colorado, hereinafter in the Contract Documents referred to as the "Owner" and Traffic Control Specialists LLC, hereinafter in the Contract Documents referred to as the "Contractor."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Owner advertised that sealed Proposals would be received for furnishing all labor, tools, supplies, equipment, materials, and everything necessary and required for the Project described by the Contract Documents and known as **Annual Traffic Control RFP-5119-22-SH**.

WHEREAS, the Contract has been awarded to the above named Contractor by the Owner, and said Contractor is now ready, willing and able to perform the Work specified in the Notice of Award, in accordance with the Contract Documents;

To clarify Section 4.2 of the original RFP document, should the Contractor be unable to fulfill their contractual obligations at any given time, it shall allow the Owner to utilize other firms to fulfill the Owner's needs.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the compensation to be paid the Contractor, the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth and subject to the terms hereinafter stated, it is mutually covenanted and agreed as follows:

ARTICLE 1

<u>Contract Documents</u>: It is agreed by the parties hereto that the following list of instruments, drawings, and documents which are attached hereto, bound herewith, or incorporated herein by reference constitute and shall be referred to either as the "Contract Documents" or the "Contract", and all of said instruments, drawings, and documents taken together as a whole constitute the Contract between the parties hereto, and they are fully a part of this agreement as if they were set out verbatim and in full herein:

- Solicitation Documents for the Project, including all Addenda; **Annual Traffic Control RFP-5119-22-SH**
- Work Change Requests (directing that changed work be performed);

- Change Orders.

ARTICLE 2

<u>Definitions:</u> The clauses provided in the Solicitation apply to the terms used in the Contract and all the Contract Documents.

ARTICLE 3

<u>Contract Work:</u> The Contractor agrees to furnish all labor, tools, supplies, equipment, materials, and all that is necessary and required to complete the tasks associated with the Work described, set forth, shown, and included in the Contract Documents as indicated in the Solicitation Document.

ARTICLE 4

Contract Price and Payment Procedures: The Contractor shall accept as full and complete compensation for the performance and completion of all of the Work specified in the Contract Documents, the rates stated in the Contractor's submitted response. The Contractor shall be paid in accordance with the work done based on each individual project, job or unforeseen event. The amount of the Contract Price is and has heretofore been appropriated by the Grand Junction City Council for the use and benefit of this Project. The Contract Price shall not be modified except by Change Order or other written directive of the Owner. The Owner shall not issue a Change Order or other written directive which requires additional work to be performed, which work causes the aggregate amount payable under this Contract to exceed the amount appropriated for this Project, unless and until the Owner provides Contractor written assurance that lawful appropriations to cover the costs of the additional work have been made.

Contract Binding: The Owner and the Contractor each binds itself, its partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives to the other party hereto in respect to all covenants, agreements and obligations contained in the Contract Documents. The Contract Documents constitute the entire agreement between the Owner and Contractor and may only be altered, amended or repealed by a duly executed written instrument. Neither the Owner nor the Contractor shall, without the prior written consent of the other, assign or sublet in whole or in part its interest under any of the Contract Documents and specifically, the Contractor shall not assign any moneys due or to become due without the prior written consent of the Owner.

ARTICLE 6

<u>Severability:</u> If any part, portion or provision of the Contract shall be found or declared null, void or unenforceable for any reason whatsoever by any court of competent jurisdiction or any governmental agency having the authority thereover, only such part, portion or provision shall be effected thereby and all other parts, portions and provisions of the Contract shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 1.0: ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION & CONDITIONS FOR SUBMITTAL

NOTE: It is the Firm's responsibility to read and review all solicitation documentation in its entirety, and to ensure that they have a clear and complete understanding of not only the scope, specifications, project requirements, etc., but also all other requirements, instructions, rules, regulations, laws, conditions, statements, procurement policies, etc. that are associated with the solicitation process and project/services being solicited.

1.1 Issuing Office: This Request for Proposal (RFP) is issued for the City of Grand Junction (Owner) on behalf of the all City Departments. All contact regarding this RFP is directed to:

The City would like to remind all Firms, Sub-Firms, Vendors, Suppliers, Manufacturers, Service Providers, etc. that (with the exception of Pre-Bid or Site Visit Meetings) all questions, inquiries, comments, or communication pertaining to any formal solicitation (whether process, specifications, scope, etc.) must be directed (in writing) to the Purchasing Agent assigned to the project, or Purchasing Division. Direct communication with the City assigned Project Managers/Engineers is not appropriate for public procurement, and may result in disqualification.

- **1.2 Purpose:** The purpose of this RFP is to obtain proposals from qualified professional firms to provide Traffic Control to the City of Grand Junction on an "as-needed" basis.
- **1.3 The Owner:** The Owner is the City of Grand Junction, Colorado and is referred to throughout this Solicitation. The term Owner means the Owner or his authorized representative.
- 1.4 Compliance: All participating Offerors, by their signature hereunder, shall agree to comply with all conditions, requirements, and instructions of this RFP as stated or implied herein. Should the Owner omit anything from this packet which is necessary to the clear understanding of the requirements, or should it appear that various instructions are in conflict, the Offeror(s) shall secure instructions from the Purchasing Division prior to the date and time of the submittal deadline shown in this RFP.
- **1.5 Procurement Process:** Procurement processes shall be governed by the most current version of the City of Grand Junction Purchasing Policy and Procedure Manual.
- 1.6 Submission: Each proposal shall be submitted in electronic format only through the Rocky Mountain E-Purchasing website at www.bidnetdirect.com/colorado. The uploaded response shall be a single PDF document with all required information included. This site offers both "free" and "paying" registration options that allow for full access of the Owner's documents and for electronic submission of proposals. - 1.7 Altering Proposals: Any alterations made prior to opening date and time must be initialed by the signer of the proposal, guaranteeing authenticity. Proposals cannot be altered or amended after submission deadline.
- 1.8 Withdrawal of Proposal: A proposal must be firm and valid for award and may not be withdrawn or canceled by the Offeror prior to the sixty-first (61st) day following the submittal deadline date and only prior to award. The Offeror so agrees upon submittal of their proposal. After award this statement is not applicable.
- 1.9 Acceptance of Proposal Content: The contents of the proposal of the successful Offeror shall become contractual obligations if acquisition action ensues. Failure of the successful Offeror to accept these obligations in a contract shall result in cancellation of the award and such vendor shall be removed from future solicitations.
- **1.10 Exclusion:** No oral, telegraphic, or telephonic proposals shall be considered.
- 1.11 Addenda: All Questions shall be submitted in writing to the appropriate person as shown in Section 1.1. Any interpretations, corrections and changes to this RFP or extensions to the opening/receipt date shall be made by a written Addendum to the RFP by the City Purchasing Division. Sole authority to authorize addenda shall be vested in the City of Grand Junction Purchasing Representative. Offerors shall acknowledge receipt of all addenda in their proposal. Addenda will be issued electronically through the Rocky Mountain E-Purchasing website at www.bidnetdirect.com/colorado and on the City's

website at www.gjcity.org/501/Purchasing/Bids. Offerors shall acknowledge receipt of all addenda in their proposal.

- 1.12 Exceptions and Substitutions: All proposals meeting the intent of this RFP shall be considered for award. Offerors taking exception to the specifications shall do so at their own risk. The Owner reserves the right to accept or reject any or all substitutions or alternatives. When offering substitutions and/or alternatives, Offeror must state these exceptions in the section pertaining to that area. Exception/substitution, if accepted, must meet or exceed the stated intent and/or specifications. The absence of such a list shall indicate that the Offeror has not taken exceptions, and if awarded a contract, shall hold the Offeror responsible to perform in strict accordance with the specifications or scope of work contained herein.
- 1.13 Confidential Material: All materials submitted in response to this RFP shall ultimately become public record and shall be subject to inspection after contract award. "Proprietary or Confidential Information" is defined as any information that is not generally known to competitors and which provides a competitive advantage. Unrestricted disclosure of proprietary information places it in the public domain. Only submittal information clearly identified with the words "Confidential Disclosure" and placed in a separate envelope shall establish a confidential, proprietary relationship. Any material to be treated as confidential or proprietary in nature must include a justification for the request. The request shall be reviewed and either approved or denied by the Purchasing Supervisor. If denied, the proposer shall have the opportunity to withdraw its entire proposal, or to remove the confidential or proprietary restrictions. Neither cost nor pricing information nor the total proposal shall be considered confidential or proprietary.
- 1.14 Response Material Ownership: All proposals become the property of the Owner upon receipt and shall only be returned to the proposer at the Owner's option. Selection or rejection of the proposal shall not affect this right. The Owner shall have the right to use all ideas or adaptations of the ideas contained in any proposal received in response to this RFP, subject to limitations outlined in the section 1.12 entitled "Confidential Material". Disqualification of a proposal does not eliminate this right.
- 1.15 Minimal Standards for Responsible Prospective Offerors: A prospective Offeror must affirmably demonstrate their responsibility. A prospective Offeror must meet the following requirements:
 - Have adequate financial resources, or the ability to obtain such resources as required.
 - Be able to comply with the required or proposed completion schedule.
 - Have a satisfactory record of performance.
 - Have a satisfactory record of integrity and ethics.
 - Be otherwise qualified and eligible to receive an award and enter into a contract with the Owner.
- 1.16 Open Records: Proposals shall be received and publicly acknowledged at the location, date, and time stated herein. Offerors, their representatives and interested persons may be present. Proposals shall be received and acknowledged only so as to avoid disclosure of process. However, all proposals shall be open for public inspection after the contract is awarded. Trade secrets and confidential information contained in the proposal so identified

- by offer as such shall be treated as confidential by the Owner to the extent allowable in the Open Records Act.
- **1.17 Sales Tax:** City of Grand Junction is, by statute, exempt from the State Sales Tax and Federal Excise Tax; therefore, all fees shall not include taxes.
- 1.18 Public Opening: Proposals shall be opened virtually immediately following the proposal deadline. Offerors, their representatives and interested persons may attend the virtual opening as noted in Section 1.6. Only the names and locations on the proposing firms will be disclosed.

SECTION 2.0: GENERAL CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 2.1. Acceptance of RFP Terms: A proposal submitted in response to this RFP shall constitute a binding offer. Acknowledgment of this condition shall be indicated on the Letter of Interest or Cover Letter by the autographic signature of the Offeror or an officer of the Offeror legally authorized to execute contractual obligations. A submission in response to the RFP acknowledges acceptance by the Offeror of all terms and conditions including compensation, as set forth herein. An Offeror shall identify clearly and thoroughly any variations between its proposal and the Owner's RFP requirements. Failure to do so shall be deemed a waiver of any rights to subsequently modify the terms of performance, except as outlined or specified in the RFP.
- 2.2. Execution, Correlation, Intent, and Interpretations: The Contract Documents shall be signed in not less than triplicate by the Owner (Owner) and Contractor. Owner will provide the contract. By executing the contract, the Contractor represents that he/she has visited the site, familiarized himself with the local conditions under which the Work is to be performed, and correlated his observations with the requirements of the Contract Documents. The Contract Documents are complementary, and what is required by any one, shall be as binding as if required by all. The intention of the documents is to include all labor, materials, equipment and other items necessary for the proper execution and completion of the scope of work as defined in the technical specifications and drawings contained herein. All drawings, specifications and copies furnished by the Owner are, and shall remain, Owner property. They are not to be used on any other project, and with the exception of one contract set for each party to the contract, are to be returned to the owner on request at the completion of the work.
- 2.3. Permits, Fees, & Notices: The Contractor shall secure and pay for all permits, governmental fees and licenses necessary for the proper execution and completion of the work. The Contractor shall give all notices and comply with all laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and orders of any public authority bearing on the performance of the work. If the Contractor observes that any of the Contract Documents are at variance in any respect, he shall promptly notify the Owner in writing, and any necessary changes shall be adjusted by approximate modification. If the Contractor performs any work knowing it to be contrary to such laws, ordinances, rules and regulations, and without such notice to the Owner, he shall assume full responsibility and shall bear all costs attributable.
- **2.4.** Responsibility for those Performing the Work: The Contractor shall be responsible to the Owner for the acts and omissions of all his employees and all other persons performing any of the work under a contract with the Contractor.
- 2.5. Payment & Completion: The Contract Sum is stated in the Contract and is the total amount payable by the Owner to the Firm for the performance of the services under the Contract Documents. Upon receipt of written notice that the services is ready for final inspection and acceptance and upon receipt of application for payment, the Owner's Project Manager will promptly make such inspection and, when they find the services acceptable under the Contract Documents and the Contract fully performed, the Owner shall make payment in the manner provided in the Contract Documents. Partial payments will be based upon estimates, prepared by the Firm, of the value of services performed and materials placed in accordance with the Contract Documents. The services performed by

Firm shall be in accordance with generally accepted professional practices and the level of competency presently maintained by other practicing professional firms in the same or similar type of services in the applicable community. The services and services to be performed by Firm hereunder shall be done in compliance with applicable laws, ordinances, rules and regulations.

- 2.6. Protection of Persons & Property: The Contractor shall comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and orders of any public authority having jurisdiction for the safety of persons or property or to protect them from damage, injury or loss. Contractor shall erect and maintain, as required by existing safeguards for safety and protection, and all reasonable precautions, including posting danger signs or other warnings against hazards promulgating safety regulations and notifying owners and users of adjacent utilities. When or where any direct or indirect damage or injury is done to public or private property by or on account of any act, omission, neglect, or misconduct by the Contractor in the execution of the work, or in consequence of the non-execution thereof by the Contractor, he shall restore, at his own expense, such property to a condition similar or equal to that existing before such damage or injury was done, by repairing, rebuilding, or otherwise restoring as may be directed, or it shall make good such damage or injury in an acceptable manner.
- 2.7. Changes in the Services: The Owner, without invalidating the contract, may order changes in the work within the general scope of the contract consisting of additions, deletions or other revisions. All such changes in the work shall be authorized by Change Order and shall be executed under the applicable conditions of the contract documents. A Change Order is a written order to the Contractor signed by the Owner issued after the execution of the contract, authorizing a change in the work or an adjustment in the contract sum or the contract time.
- **2.8. Minor Changes in the Services:** The Owner shall have authority to order minor changes in the work not involving an adjustment in the contract sum or an extension of the contract time and not inconsistent with the intent of the contract documents.
- 2.9. Uncovering & Correction of Work: The Contractor shall promptly correct all work found by the Owner as defective or as failing to conform to the contract documents. The Contractor shall bear all costs of correcting such rejected work, including the cost of the Owner's additional services thereby made necessary. The Owner shall give such notice promptly after discover of condition. All such defective or non-conforming work under the above paragraphs shall be removed from the site where necessary and the work shall be corrected to comply with the contract documents without cost to the Owner.
- 2.10. Acceptance Not Waiver: The Owner's acceptance or approval of any services furnished hereunder shall not in any way relieve the proposer of their present responsibility to maintain the high quality, integrity and timeliness of his services. The Owner's approval or acceptance of, or payment for, any services shall not be construed as a future waiver of any rights under this Contract, or of any cause of action arising out of performance under this Contract.

- **2.11. Change Order/Amendment:** No oral statement of any person shall modify or otherwise change, or affect the terms, conditions or specifications stated in the resulting contract. All amendments to the contract shall be made in writing by the Owner Purchasing Division.
- **2.12. Assignment:** The Offeror shall not sell, assign, transfer or convey any contract resulting from this RFP, in whole or in part, without the prior written approval from the Owner.
- 2.13. Compliance with Laws: Proposals must comply with all Federal, State, County and local laws governing or covering this type of service and the fulfillment of all ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) requirements.
- **2.14. Debarment/Suspension:** The Firm herby certifies that the Firm is not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Governmental department or agency.
- **2.15.** Confidentiality: All information disclosed by the Owner to the Offeror for the purpose of the work to be done or information that comes to the attention of the Offeror during the course of performing such work is to be kept strictly confidential.
- **2.16.** Conflict of Interest: No public official and/or Owner employee shall have interest in any contract resulting from this RFP.
- 2.17. Contract: This Request for Proposal, submitted documents, and any negotiations, when properly accepted by the Owner, shall constitute a contract equally binding between the Owner and Offeror. The contract represents the entire and integrated agreement between the parties hereto and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements, either written or oral, including the Proposal documents. The contract may be amended or modified with Change Orders, Field Orders, or Addendums.
- **2.18. Project Manager/Administrator:** The Project Manager, on behalf of the Owner, shall render decisions in a timely manner pertaining to the work proposed or performed by the Offeror. The Project Manager shall be responsible for approval and/or acceptance of any related performance of the Scope of Services. The Project Manager will vary based on the individual service being performed.
- 2.19. Contract Termination: This contract shall remain in effect until any of the following occurs: (1) contract expires; (2) completion of services; (3) acceptance of services or, (4) for convenience terminated by either party with a written Notice of Cancellation stating therein the reasons for such cancellation and the effective date of cancellation at least thirty days past notification.
- **2.20. Employment Discrimination**: During the performance of any services per agreement with the Owner, the Offeror, by submitting a Proposal, agrees to the following conditions:
 - 2.20.1. The Offeror shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, age, disability, citizenship status, marital status, veteran status, sexual orientation, national origin, or any legally protected status except when such condition is a legitimate occupational qualification reasonably necessary for the normal operations of the Offeror. The

- Offeror agrees to post in conspicuous places, visible to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
- **2.20.2.** The Offeror, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Offeror, shall state that such Offeror is an Equal Opportunity Employer.
- **2.20.3.** Notices, advertisements, and solicitations placed in accordance with federal law, rule, or regulation shall be deemed sufficient for the purpose of meeting the requirements of this section.
- 2.21. Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 and Immigration Compliance: The Offeror certifies that it does not and will not during the performance of the contract employ workers without authorization or otherwise violate the provisions of the Federal Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 and/or the immigration compliance requirements of State of Colorado C.R.S. § 8-17.5-101, et.seq. (House Bill 06-1343).
- **2.22. Ethics:** The Offeror shall not accept or offer gifts or anything of value nor enter into any business arrangement with any employee, official, or agent of the Owner.
- **2.23.** Failure to Deliver: In the event of failure of the Offeror to deliver services in accordance with the contract terms and conditions, the Owner, after due oral or written notice, may procure the services from other sources and hold the Offeror responsible for any costs resulting in additional purchase and administrative services. This remedy shall be in addition to any other remedies that the Owner may have.
- **2.24.** Failure to Enforce: Failure by the Owner at any time to enforce the provisions of the contract shall not be construed as a waiver of any such provisions. Such failure to enforce shall not affect the validity of the contract or any part thereof or the right of the Owner to enforce any provision at any time in accordance with its terms.
- **2.25.** Force Majeure: The Offeror shall not be held responsible for failure to perform the duties and responsibilities imposed by the contract due to legal strikes, fires, riots, rebellions, and acts of God beyond the control of the Offeror, unless otherwise specified in the contract.
- 2.26. Indemnification: Offeror shall defend, indemnify and save harmless the Owner, State of Colorado, and all its officers, employees, insurers, and self-insurance pool, from and against all liability, suits, actions, or other claims of any character, name and description brought for or on account of any injuries or damages received or sustained by any person, persons, or property on account of any negligent act or fault of the Offeror, or of any Offeror's agent, employee, subcontractor or supplier in the execution of, or performance under, any contract which may result from proposal award. Offeror shall pay any judgment with cost which may be obtained against the Owner growing out of such injury or damages.
- 2.27. Independent Firm: The Offeror shall be legally considered an Independent Firm and neither the Firm nor its employees shall, under any circumstances, be considered servants or agents of the Owner. The Owner shall be at no time legally responsible for any negligence or other wrongdoing by the Firm, its servants, or agents. The Owner shall not withhold from the contract payments to the Firm any federal or state unemployment taxes, federal or state income taxes, Social Security Tax or any other amounts for benefits to the

Firm. Further, the Owner shall not provide to the Firm any insurance coverage or other benefits, including Workers' Compensation, normally provided by the Owner for its employees.

- 2.28. Nonconforming Terms and Conditions: A proposal that includes terms and conditions that do not conform to the terms and conditions of this Request for Proposal is subject to rejection as non-responsive. The Owner reserves the right to permit the Offeror to withdraw nonconforming terms and conditions from its proposal prior to a determination by the Owner of non-responsiveness based on the submission of nonconforming terms and conditions.
- **2.29.** Ownership: All plans, prints, designs, concepts, etc., shall become the property of the Owner.
- **2.30. Oral Statements:** No oral statement of any person shall modify or otherwise affect the terms, conditions, or specifications stated in this document and/or resulting agreement. All modifications to this request and any agreement must be made in writing by the Owner.
- 2.31. Patents/Copyrights: The Offeror agrees to protect the Owner from any claims involving infringements of patents and/or copyrights. In no event shall the Owner be liable to the Offeror for any/all suits arising on the grounds of patent(s)/copyright(s) infringement. Patent/copyright infringement shall null and void any agreement resulting from response to this RFP.
- **2.32.** Remedies: The Offeror and Owner agree that both parties have all rights, duties, and remedies available as stated in the Uniform Commercial Code.
- **2.33. Venue**: Any agreement as a result of responding to this RFP shall be deemed to have been made in, and shall be construed and interpreted in accordance with, the laws of the City of Grand Junction, Mesa County, Colorado.
- **2.34.** Expenses: Expenses incurred in preparation, submission and presentation of this RFP are the responsibility of the company and can not be charged to the Owner.
- 2.35. Sovereign Immunity: The Owner specifically reserves its right to sovereign immunity pursuant to Colorado State Law as a defense to any action arising in conjunction to this agreement.
- 2.36. Public Funds/Non-Appropriation of Funds: Funds for payment have been provided through the City of Grand Junction budget approved by the City Council for the stated fiscal year only. State of Colorado statutes prohibit the obligation and expenditure of public funds beyond the fiscal year for which a budget has been approved. Therefore, anticipated orders or other obligations that may arise past the end of the stated City of Grand Junction fiscal year shall be subject to budget approval. Any contract will be subject to and must contain a governmental non-appropriation of funds clause.
- 2.37. Collusion Clause: Each Offeror by submitting a proposal certifies that it is not party to any collusive action or any action that may be in violation of the Sherman Antitrust Act. Any and all proposals shall be rejected if there is evidence or reason for believing that

- collusion exists among the proposers. The Owner may or may not, at the discretion of the Owner Purchasing Representative, accept future proposals for the same service or commodities for participants in such collusion.
- 2.38. Gratuities: The proposer certifies and agrees that no gratuities, kickbacks or contingency fees were paid in connection with this contract, nor were any fees, commissions, gifts or other considerations made contingent upon the award of this contract. If the proposer breaches or violates this warranty, the Owner may, at their discretion, terminate this contract without liability to the Owner.
- 2.39. OSHA Standards: All Offerors agree and warrant that services performed in response to this invitation shall conform to the standards declared by the US Department of Labor under the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (OSHA). In the event the services do not conform to OSHA Standards, the Owner may require the services to be redone at no additional expense to the Owner.
- **2.40. Performance of the Contract:** The Owner reserves the right to enforce the performance of the contract in any manner prescribed by law or deemed to be in the best interest of the Owner in the event of breach or default of resulting contract award.
- **2.41.** Benefit Claims: The Owner shall not provide to the Offeror any insurance coverage or other benefits, including Worker's Compensation, normally provided by the Owner for its employees.
- 2.42. Default: The Owner reserves the right to terminate the contract immediately in the event the Offeror fails to meet delivery or completion schedules, or otherwise perform in accordance with the accepted proposal. Breach of contract or default authorizes the Owner to purchase like services elsewhere and charge the full increase in cost to the defaulting Offeror.
- **2.43. Multiple Offers:** Proposers must determine for themselves which product to offer. If said proposer chooses to submit more than one offer, THE ALTERNATE OFFER must be clearly marked "Alternate Proposal". The Owner reserves the right to make award in the best interest of the Owner.
- 2.44. Cooperative Purchasing: Purchases as a result of this solicitation are primarily for the Owner. Other governmental entities may be extended the opportunity to utilize the resultant contract award with the agreement of the successful provider and the participating agencies. All participating entities will be required to abide by the specifications, terms, conditions and pricings established in this Proposal. The quantities furnished in this proposal document are for only the Owner. It does not include quantities for any other jurisdiction. The Owner will be responsible only for the award for our jurisdiction. Other participating entities will place their own awards on their respective Purchase Orders through their purchasing office or use their purchasing card for purchase/payment as authorized or agreed upon between the provider and the individual entity. The Owner accepts no liability for payment of orders placed by other participating jurisdictions that choose to piggy-back on our solicitation. Orders placed by participating jurisdictions under the terms of this solicitation will indicate their specific delivery and invoicing instructions.

2.45. Definitions:

- **2.45.1.** "Consultant" refers to the person, partnership, firm or corporation entering into an Agreement with the Owner for the services required and the legal representatives of said party or the agent appointed to act for said party in the performance of the service(s) contracted for.
- 2.45.2. "Offeror" refers to the person or persons legally authorized by the Consultant to make an offer and/or submit a response (fee) proposal in response to the Owner's RFP
- **2.45.3.** The term "Work" includes all labor necessary to produce the requirements by the Contract Documents, and all materials and equipment incorporated or to be incorporated in such construction.
- "Owner" is the City of Grand Junction, Colorado and is referred to throughout the 2.45.4. Contract Documents. The term Owner means the Owner or his authorized representative. The Owner shall, at all times, have access to the work wherever it is in preparation and progress. The Contractor shall provide facilities for such access. The Owner will make periodic visits to the site to familiarize himself generally with the progress and quality of work and to determine, in general, if the work is proceeding in accordance with the contract documents. Based on such observations and the Contractor's Application for Payment, the Owner will determine the amounts owing to the Contractor and will issue Certificates for Payment in such amounts, as provided in the contract. The Owner will have authority to reject work which does not conform to the Contract documents. Whenever, in his reasonable opinion, he considers it necessary or advisable to insure the proper implementation of the intent of the Contract Documents, he will have authority to require the Contractor to stop the work or any portion, or to require special inspection or testing of the work, whether or not such work can be then be fabricated, installed, or completed. The Owner will not be responsible for the acts or omissions of the Contractor, and sub-Contractor, or any of their agents or employees, or any other persons performing any of the work.
- 2.45.5. "Contractor is the person or organization identified as such in the Agreement and is referred to throughout the Contract Documents. The term Contractor means the Contractor or his authorized representative. The Contractor shall carefully study and compare the General Contract Conditions of the Contract, Specification and Drawings, Scope of Work, Addenda and Modifications and shall at once report to the Owner any error, inconsistency or omission he may discover. Contractor shall not be liable to the Owner for any damage resulting from such errors, inconsistencies or omissions. The Contractor shall not commence work without clarifying Drawings, Specifications, or Interpretations.
- **2.45.6.** "Sub-Contractor is a person or organization who has a direct contract with the Contractor to perform any of the work at the site. The term sub-contractor is referred to throughout the contract documents and means a sub-contractor or his authorized representative.
- **2.46.** Public Disclosure Record: If the Proposer has knowledge of their employee(s) or subproposers having an immediate family relationship with a Owner employee or elected official, the proposer must provide the Purchasing Representative with the name(s) of these individuals. These individuals are required to file an acceptable "Public Disclosure Record", a statement of financial interest, before conducting business with the Owner.

2.47. Keep Jobs in Colorado Act: Contractor shall be responsible for ensuring compliance with Article 17 of Title 8, Colorado Revised Statutes requiring 80% Colorado labor to be employed on public works projects. Contractor shall, upon reasonable notice provided by the Owner, permit the Owner to inspect documentation of identification and residency required by C.R.S. §8-17-101(2)(a). If Contractor claims it is entitled to a waiver pursuant to C.R.S. §8-17-101(1), Contractor shall state that there is insufficient Colorado labor to perform the work such that compliance with Article 17 would create an undue burden that would substantially prevent a project from proceeding to completion, and shall include evidence demonstrating the insufficiency and undue burden in its response.

Unless expressly granted a waiver by the Owner pursuant to C.R.S. §8-17-101(1), Contractor shall be responsible for ensuring compliance with Article 17 of Title 8, Colorado Revised Statutes requiring 80% Colorado labor to be employed on public works. Contractor shall, upon reasonable notice provided by the Owner, permit the Owner to inspect documentation of identification and residency required by C.R.S. §8-17-101(2)(a).

- 2.47.1. "Public Works project" is defined as:
 - (a) any construction, alteration, repair, demolition, or improvement of any land, building, structure, facility, road, highway, bridge, or other public improvement suitable for and intended for use in the promotion of the public health, welfare, or safety and any maintenance programs for the upkeep of such projects
 - (b) for which appropriate or expenditure of moneys may be reasonably expected to be \$500,000.00 or more in the aggregate for any fiscal year
 - (c) except any project that receives federal moneys.

SECTION 3.0: INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Insurance Requirements: The selected Firm agrees to procure and maintain, at its own cost, policy(s) of insurance sufficient to insure against all liability, claims, demands, and other obligations assumed by the Firm pursuant to this Section. Such insurance shall be in addition to any other insurance requirements imposed by this Contract or by law. The Firm shall not be relieved of any liability, claims, demands, or other obligations assumed pursuant to this Section by reason of its failure to procure or maintain insurance in sufficient amounts, durations, or types.

Firm shall procure and maintain and, if applicable, shall cause any Subcontractor of the Firm to procure and maintain insurance coverage listed below. Such coverage shall be procured and maintained with forms and insurers acceptable to The Owner. All coverage shall be continuously maintained to cover all liability, claims, demands, and other obligations assumed by the Firm pursuant to this Section. In the case of any claims-made policy, the necessary retroactive dates and extended reporting periods shall be procured to maintain such continuous coverage. Minimum coverage limits shall be as indicated below unless specified otherwise in the Special Conditions:

(a) Worker Compensation insurance to cover obligations imposed by applicable laws for any employee engaged in the performance of work under this Contract, and Employers' Liability insurance with minimum limits of:

ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000) each accident,

ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000) disease - policy limit, and ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000) disease - each employee

(b) General Liability insurance with minimum combined single limits of:

ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000) each occurrence and ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000) per job aggregate.

The policy shall be applicable to all premises and operations. The policy shall include coverage for bodily injury, broad form property damage (including completed operations), personal injury (including coverage for contractual and employee acts), blanket contractual, products, and completed operations. The policy shall include coverage for explosion, collapse, and underground hazards. The policy shall contain a severability of interests provision.

(c) Comprehensive Automobile Liability insurance with minimum combined single limits for bodily injury and property damage of not less than:

ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000) each occurrence and ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000) aggregate

This policy shall provide coverage to protect the contractor against liability incurred as a result of the professional services performed as a result of responding to this Solicitation.

With respect to each of Consultant's owned, hired, or non-owned vehicles assigned to be used in performance of the Work. The policy shall contain a severability of interests provision. The policies required by paragraphs (b), and (c) above shall be endorsed to include the Owner and the Owner's officers and employees as additional insureds. Every policy required above shall be primary insurance, and any insurance carried by the Owner, its officers, or its employees, or carried by or provided through any insurance pool of the Owner, shall be excess and not contributory insurance to that provided by Consultant. No additional insured endorsement to any required policy shall contain any exclusion for bodily injury or property damage arising from completed operations. The Consultant shall be solely responsible for any deductible losses under any policy required above.

SECTION 4.0: SPECIFICATIONS/SCOPE OF SERVICES

- **4.1. General:** The City of Grand Junction would like to enter into an annual contract with a professional traffic control firm to provide all related services as required, on an "as needed" basis; including emergency road closures due to weather, natural disaster, power outage, vehicle crash, etc. Other occasions may arise that are not predictable. Scheduled annual events are found in Section 4.4.
- **4.2. Special Conditions/Provisions:** This contract will be non-exclusive. The City may, at its sole discretion, contract with other entities for work similar to this contract. Contractor may contract to perform similar work for others and is not expected to work exclusively for the City.
- **4.3. Price/Fees:** Services pricing shall be **all inclusive**, to include, but not limited to labor, materials, equipment, travel, drawings, mobilization, demobilization, shipping/freight, engineering, licenses, permits, fees, etc. The Owner desires to use the same price list for all projects throughout the year.
- 4.4. Specifications/Scope of Services: The following individual projects are described in as much detail as possible. The list shall not be considered comprehensive as other traffic control events may surface throughout the year. The selected Traffic Control Contractor will be responsible for performing in accordance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD).
 - **4.4.1 Street Patching:** The Grand Junction Streets Division performs patching as needed on all streets within City Limits.
 - Services typically begin at 6:00 A.M. each day, starting in <u>March and continuing</u> through October (weather permitting). Dates and locations will vary.
 - Arrow and sign boards shall be used as required by the State.
 - The traffic control crews will move throughout the city as needed with the street patching crews.
 - The Traffic Control Supervisor shall have a cell phone and provide the Streets Department with the number. The Supervisor shall be able to communicate with employees via cell phone or radio
 - **4.4.2 Spring Cleanup:** The Grand Junction Streets Division performs spring cleanup operations in various neighborhoods within City Limits.
 - Services typically begin at 6:00 A.M. each day, <u>starting the first Monday in April for a duration of two weeks</u>. Dates and locations may vary.
 - Arrow and sign boards shall be used as required by the State.
 - The traffic control crews will move throughout the city as needed with the spring cleanup crews.
 - The Traffic Control Supervisor shall have a cell phone and provide the Streets Department with the number. The Supervisor shall be able to communicate with employees via cell phone or radio.
 - **4.4.3 JUCO**: The Grand Junction Police Department provides traffic control for the Junior College World Series (JUCO) Baseball Tournament.

- The tournament <u>begins the Saturday before Memorial Day and will last approximately one week</u>. Hours vary based on game times each day.
- This project requires traffic control for each of the night games.
- The project will require traffic control services to regulate traffic flow, control traffic and pedestrians in accordance with the traffic control plan.
- The traffic control plan disperses stadium traffic to major street arterials and temporarily diverts local traffic to side streets according to the Traffic Control plan.
- The contractor shall mobilize employees to set up traffic control equipment by the seventh inning of the last game every evening of the tournament (The seventh inning usually starts at 9:15 P.M. and game ends about 10:00 – 11 P.M. depending on the game).
- Traffic Control Personnel (Flaggers) shall be in place to direct traffic by the end of the eighth (8th) inning every evening of the tournament. It shall be the contractor's responsibility to determine when the Flagger can safely be put in position to direct traffic.
- Contractor shall take down traffic control equipment and demobilize after traffic has dispersed or as requested at the direction of the Police Department.
- Fencing or barricades shall be required on the North Avenue median between North 12th Street and North 15th Street. Fencing shall be sturdy and durable enough to withstand strong winds and pedestrian abuse. This fencing is required to be in place the Friday evening prior to the commencement of the tournament and shall remain so for the duration of the tournament.
- Fencing shall be removed no later than the afternoon of the day following the conclusion of the tournament.
- Arrow and sign boards shall be used as required by the State.
- The Traffic Control Supervisor shall have a cell phone and provide the Police Department with the number. The Supervisor shall be able to communicate with employees via cell phone or radio.
- Traffic control will not be required for games cancelled due to rain.
- **4.4.4 Chip Seal:** The Grand Junction Streets Division performs chip sealing operations in various neighborhoods within City Limits.
 - Services typically begin at 5:00 A.M. each day for connector and arterial roads and 6:00 A.M. for local streets.
 - The Chip Seal operations <u>starts the first Monday in June and continues through July.</u> Dates and locations may vary.
 - Arrow and sign boards shall be used as required by the State.
 - Traffic control crews will move throughout the city as needed with the chip seal crews.
 - Traffic Control Supervisor shall have a cell phone and provide the Streets Department with the number. The Supervisor shall be able to communicate with employees via cell phone or radio.
- **4.4.5 4**th **of July:** The fireworks show is hosted by the Grand Junction Parks & Recreation Department and is held each year at Lincoln Park.
 - The awarded contractor shall provide fencing to secure the fireworks safety zone as early as the day before the event, depending on when the explosives arrive on site.

- Safety zone fencing shall be removed on July 5th.
- Parking lot control shall be in place on <u>July 4th</u> no later than 3:00 P.M. This time may vary based on communication with staff.
- Contractor will control vehicle entry into Lincoln Park by allowing cars to leave, and only authorized personnel will be allowed entrance.
- Traffic control services are required to regulate traffic flow, control traffic and pedestrians.
- The traffic control plan disperses stadium traffic after the show to major street arterials and temporarily diverts local traffic to side streets according to the Traffic Control Plan.
- The Contractor shall divert local traffic to side streets during the fireworks show.
- The contractor shall mobilize employees to set up traffic control equipment allowing sufficient time to have everything in place prior to 9:30 P.M.
- It shall be the contractor's responsibility to determine when Flaggers can safely be put in position to direct traffic.
- Contractor shall remove traffic control equipment and demobilize after traffic has dispersed or as requested at the direction of the Parks & Rec Department.
- Arrow and sign boards shall be used as required by the State.
- The Traffic Control Supervisor shall have a cell phone and provide the Parks & Rec Department with the number. The Supervisor shall be able to communicate with employees via cell phone or radio.
- 4.4.6 Special Events: The Grand Junction Parks and Recreation Department hosts various Special Events throughout the year. Examples are Southwest Arbor Fest, Senior Games, Water Lights At Night, Santa Cause Run, etc. Traffic Control may be required. The awarded Traffic Control Contractor will be contacted on an as-needed basis by the Parks & Rec Department based on the needs of each individual Event.

For proper comparison and evaluation, the City requires that proposals be formatted A to F.

C. STRATEGY AND IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

Traffic Control Specialists (TCS) has covered each aspect of the listed projects and all additional work that The City of Grand Junction has needed over the last 6 years. We have worked with all aspects of the specified work listed and additional departments covering a multitude of scenarios. The explanations below will highlight how TCS works to keep the projects safe and adapt to what is needed for all The City of Grand Junction traffic control needs.

4.4.1 Street Patching

TCS has utilized multiple setups and personnel to cover all traffic control requirements for the streets department. The latest was the multi-day lane closures on I-70B that allowed the crews to complete various patching projects along the highway.

4.4.2 Spring Cleanup

TCS has aided the Spring Cleanup crew in 2021 and 2022. We utilize 2 flaggers and a Traffic Control Supervisor. We provide 2 TCS vehicles and an arrow board to allow us to safely maneuver with the crew at a pace that allows them to get their work completed on schedule.

4.4.3 JUCO

TCS provided the traffic control for JUCO in 2001 & 2022 and received positive feedback from the police department and the JUCO staff. I have attached the Traffic Control Plan that we have revised from previous years for JUCO. The changes we implemented helped the flow of traffic and kept our flaggers out of the flow of traffic. We do a preset of all signs the day before the World Series begins and lay out the pedestrian fencing down the median of North Ave from 12^{th} St. This project requires a minimum of 2 Traffic Control Supervisors, 12 Flaggers, and 4 TCS vehicles to provide a safe and efficient release at the end of the last game.

4.4.4 Chip Seal

TCS has held the Chip Seal contract for the City of Grand Junction since 2016. Lisa Schave, Traffic Control Supervisor (TCS), has handled these seamlessly from the first day of the project. She has formed a rapport and positive working experience with the City of Grand Junction crew and will be handling these in the following years if awarded the contract. This

project takes pre-planning and cooperation between the TCS and the work crew to manage the high paced and high traffic in the areas that we assist with. On average, the Chip Seals require 4-15 flaggers depending on the areas that day.

4.4.5 4th of July

TCS provided the traffic control in 2021 and 2022 for the 4th of July Fireworks celebration at Lincoln Park and received positive feedback from the parks and rec department. I have attached the Traffic Control Plan that we have revised from previous years for the 4th of July. The changes we implemented helped the flow of traffic and kept our flaggers out of the flow of traffic. We do a preset of all signs the 3rd of July and set the pedestrian fencing in the parking lot to allow the setup of the area needed for safety. This project requires a minimum of 2 Traffic Control Supervisors, 12 Flaggers, and 4 TCS vehicles to provide a safe and efficient release at the end of the show.


4.4.6 Special Events

TCS has an excellent relationship with the downtown development events coordinator, Kyra Seppie, and worked with her to develop a Traffic Control Plan that could safely be utilized by all standard parades and events in the Main Street area. TCS has covered a variety of special events around the Grand Junction area. Examples include 5K runs, homecoming parades, and the 4th of July Parade.

Additional projects:

TCS has been the go-to for Ron Key and the water department for all emergency water breaks, new taps, and any additional needs. We have worked with Ron and the water department for the last four years and hope to continue providing excellent service to him. Response times and on-call personnel are key to making sure these projects are covered. In the past years our response time has been less than 60 minutes to be onsite and setup for what they are needing.

TCS has also provided the traffic control for Tom Lanum and the City of Grand Junction Traffic Division. We have worked with the crew to change out multiple power boxes and lights in high traffic intersections. We have developed a plan and have been able to make these dangerous situations manageable with zero incidents.
