



System Changes


- +9 parking corrals (39 total)
- Piloted 8 MPH slow zones for some events
- +20% fleet cap expansion from Lime
- Ongoing discussion of access at CMU
- Adjusted Riverfront Trail boundary





Q3 Utilization


- Highest ridership Downtown, Las Colonias/Eagle Rim, CMU, Horizon Drive, and Lincoln Park.
- 7th, 10th, and 12th most favored for N/S access.
- Map development still in progress (missing trips on parts of Riverfront Trail, 50 south of I-70B, etc.)

Additional Outcomes Q3 2023

Higher rate of EMS responses:

- 13 in Q3, 15 during pilot overall.
- Most of the 13 patients had alcohol or drug use noted.
- Helmets were not noted in most incidents.

Complaints are under 2/month!

Still want to reduce incidence of sidewalk blockage





Plans/next steps

- Implement rider surveys.
- Investigate utilization in Priority Zones (CDBG areas).
- Consider Horizon Drive Mandatory Parking Zone.
- Develop an outreach plan to improve awareness of low-income options.
- Finalize map layouts to ensure data integrity.
- Continue close partnership with operators to improve parking compliance.
- Consider new use cases and possible pilot area expansion.
- Present utilization data to support infrastructure prioritesand Junction









Alternative Section A - "Shared Use Path - Ped/Bike Separated" - at Intersections: 93 Ft ROW
