PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, 4-H is a community of young people, across America, learning leadership, citizenship, and life skills that began in 1902; and

WHEREAS, the Junior and Senior Mesa County 4-H Shotgun Shooting Sports teams competed at the 2013 State Fair Shotgun Shooting Competition over the Labor Day weekend in Colorado Springs; and

WHEREAS, there were juniors ages 8 to 13 and seniors ages 14 to 18 who competed against twenty-three other counties with a total of 750 individual competitors; and

WHEREAS, the competition consisted of Sporting Clays, Skeet, and Trap under the leadership of Coach Randy Stout; and

WHEREAS, the Junior Team received the Reserve Grand Champion award for Skeet (second overall in the State), third place for Trap, and third place for Sporting Clays; and

WHEREAS, the Senior Team received the Grand Champion award for Sporting Clays, Grand Champion award for Skeet, and Grand Champion award for High Overall Team. Two seniors qualified to represent the State at the National competition in 2014, and two seniors were selected as alternates for the National Team; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Mesa County should be proud of these young men and women for their skills and spirit.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Sam Susuras, by the power vested in me as Mayor of the City of Grand Junction, do hereby proclaim October 3, 2013 as
