I. <u>Call to Order</u>

The meeting was called to order at 2:01 p.m. Those present were Hearing Officer Sam D. Starritt, City Attorney John Shaver, Deputy City Clerk Selestina Sandoval.

Hearing Officer Starritt read renewals 1 – 4 into the record and verified with Ms. Sandoval the applications were in order. Hearing Officer Starritt asked if anyone was present to speak against any of the applications; there was no one.

Renewals 1 - 4 were approved.

III. New License Applications – Resolutions, Finding and Decisions

1. Gears and Grinds, LLC dba Mountain Air Roasters, 126 N 7th Street, Grand Junction, CO 81501, Tavern

Managing Member: Jack Andersen, 300 Bella Court, Grand Junction, CO 81507

Jack Andersen was present to answer questions regarding the new license application and how the needs and desires survey was conducted. Hearing Officer Starritt asked Ms. Sandoval to read the survey results into the record (attached).

Hearing Officer Starritt verified with Ms. Sandoval the application was in order. Ms. Sandoval reported that the background results had not been received. Hearing Officer Starritt asked if anyone was present to speak against the application. There was no one.

Hearing Officer Starritt found the needs of the neighborhood are not being met and found no legal reason to deny the license. The new Tavern license application for Gears and Grinds, LLC dba Mountain Air Roasters was approved contingent upon clear background results being received. He also asked the applicant to ensure he obtains responsible server training. The City Clerk's Office will prepare a resolution of findings for Hearing Officer Starritt's signature.

Development Director/Event Manager Ami Schiffbauer was present and answered a series of questions regarding the event location, security, and how it will be conducted lawfully. Hearing Officer Starritt verified with Ms. Sandoval the application was in order and asked if there was anyone present to speak against the application. There was no one. Hearing Officer Starritt entered Exhibits "A" and "B" (attached) into the record.

Hearing Officer Starritt found that pursuant to the Colorado State Statue 44-05-106, there are no grounds to deny the special event permit; it would not be injurious to the public welfare because of the nature of the special event, its location within the community, or the failure of the applicant in past special events to conduct the event in compliance with applicable laws. The application for the special event permit submitted by Mesa County Libraries Foundation for "Sippin' in the Stacks - 2024" was in order and approved contingent upon Ms. Schiffbauer obtaining training on the checking acceptable forms of identification for the service of alcohol.

A tavern liquor license application permitting sales of malt, vinous and spirituous liquor for consumption at place where sold, was filed with the Local Licensing Authority on April 12, 2024 and on May 1, 2024 a legal notice was published in the Daily Sentinel and a "Notice of Hearing" was posted on the property.

A survey was conducted by the applicant to address the reasonable requirements of the neighborhood. The neighborhood was defined on the north by Gunnison Avenue, south by Pitkin Avenue, east by North 3rd Street and west by North 12th Street and includes both sides of the outer boundary streets. The City Clerk's Office reviewed the findings and obtained the following results (map attached):

FAVOR: 51 OPPOSE: 0

Four signatures were disqualified due to incomplete entries. Exhibits to survey sheets showed 120 addresses attempted without success due to no answer or no solicitors signs. To date, no counter petitions or remonstrances have been filed.

The Grand Junction Police Department will investigate the individuals for local criminal history. Reports have also been requested from Mesa County Public Heath, the Grand Junction Fire Department, and the City of Grand Junction Sales Tax Department.


