PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, in October, 1982, the first "Oktoberfest Celebration" was held on Main Street in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado; and

WHEREAS, the Harvest Festival event has been celebrated by many organizations with food booths, arts and crafts, a beer garden, entertainment, and dancing; and

WHEREAS, Frau Bürgermeisterin, Brittni Nack, has been chosen to serve as this year's Bürgermeisterin. Brittni is in her fourth year of taking German at Central High School. She participated in a German student exchange last year, visiting Central High School's partner school Gymnasium Waldkraiburg in Bavaria.
