# Approval of Minutes:

Abe made a motion to approve the minutes of the October 24, 2024, Downtown Business Improvement District Board meeting. Doug seconded the motion. The motion was approved.

#### **REGULAR AGENDA**

#### **HOLIDAY EVENT AND PROMOTION UPDATES**

Brandon announced that the Hello Lamp Post A.I. chat will launch on Black Friday. Visitors can scan the QR codes on various signage including sandwich boards, table placards and stickers to chat with "Chromeo", the A.I. assistant, in English or Spanish. Chromeo will answer questions about Downtown, holiday events, and local businesses.

The Holiday Downtowner is scheduled for Thursday, November 21<sup>st</sup>, from 5-8 pm in the Margery Building Ballroom. Catering will be provided by Suehiro Japanese Restaurant, with beverages from Carlson Vineyards and Melrose Spirit Co.

Kyra provided an events update.

- **Downtown Tree Lighting** will be held this Saturday, November 23<sup>rd</sup> from 5-7 pm, featuring Santa Claus and live entertainment.
- **Festive Fridays** is a new promotion this year and will start on Friday, November 29<sup>th</sup>. It is a merchant-led campaign encouraging Downtown businesses to extend their hours on Friday evenings until December 20<sup>th</sup>. Shoppers can enjoy holiday lights, themed nights, and entertainment.
- Downtown Parade of Lights will be held on Saturday, December 7<sup>th</sup> at 5 pm. This year's parade will feature 80 floats. Collaborating with Jenny, from the city's sustainability department and R. Cup, reusable coffee cups will be collected in designated bins and sent to Denver for washing to minimize waste. Food vendors and businesses are participating, and a map of bin locations will be provided. Jenny is organizing a volunteer team to assist with the effort.

Brandon shared that Rob Davis provided updates on Downtown holiday lighting. The City Parks Department increased the decorated trees to 133 this year, up from 122 last year, using 285,000 LED bulbs. Some areas remain unlit due to limited power access. Installing the lights required approximately 1,500 staff hours.
