Parks Improvement Advisory Board Regular Meeting – October 1, 2013

Item 1: Meeting Called to Order by Bruce Hill at 12:03 p.m.

Bruce Hill requested the PIAB members introduce themselves and state their affiliation with the Board.

Item 2: Approve Minutes

Sam Susuras moved to approve the July 2, 2013 Parks Improvement Advisory Board minutes. Lena Elliott seconded. Motion was approved unanimously.

Motion adopted by the Parks Improvement Advisory Board: Yes 4 No 0

Item 3: Welcome City Council Member Barbara Traylor Smith

Council Member Barbara Traylor Smith was unable to attend the meeting.

Item 4: Fees and Charges Review

Rob Schoeber reviewed the Fees and Charges summary (see attached), stating the spreadsheet only consists of the fees that affect the partners and that have proposed increases. Mr. Schoeber said the City is not proposing to readjust the partner flat fee contract for a three year period, which began in 2011. (The flat fees will be re-negotiated in 2014 for a January 1, 2015 effective date.)

City staff will be meeting with School District 51 and Colorado Mesa University in the near future to discuss potential changes in the contracts, such as additional needs that were not originally included in the flat fees.

Rob Schoeber reviewed the worksheet in detail, specifically discussing the hospitality suite, as well as the substantial fee differences that currently exist between renting the football field versus the baseball field. Paul Cain expressed concern regarding the cost of scheduling baseball games at Suplizio Field versus Canyon View Park. Rob Schoeber stated the baseball games were included in the flat fee, so the increase would not impact the School District or CMU. Bruce Hill expressed concern that the City and the partners have discontinued tracking spectator numbers, stating there will not be anything to base the flat fees on during future negotiations. Tom Spicer requested the next flat fee be based on a three year budget and stated he would prefer the fee remain the same versus potentially decreasing then later spiking again. Paul Cain expressed concern that the IGA's and the flat fees were not included in the fees and charges summary worksheet.

Paul Cain moved to support the proposed 2014 Fees and Charges policy in addition to the existing IGA's and flat fee rates with School District 51, Colorado Mesa University, JUCO, and Rockies. Sam Susuras seconded.

Motion adopted by the Parks Improvement Advisory Board: Yes 4 No 0

Item 5: Calendar for next year

The Board members approved the proposed 2014 meeting calendar and said they will continue to schedule extra meetings as needed for any special projects and/or agenda items.

Item 6: Financial Report

Jay Valentine passed out a revised copy of the financial report (see attached) and stated the reason for the revision was due to the name change from Mesa College to Colorado Mesa University. Ending funds available: \$178,653.07, which does not include the \$50,000 transfer for the Lincoln Park tennis courts project. Mr. Valentine briefly discussed the mysterious dividends that keep showing up, stating this stock was sold quite some time ago and the investment company has been contacted on numerous occasions.

Item 7: Other Business

Tom Spicer discussed the proposed additions to the stadium track and field, due to the University's new men's track and field program. At this time there are no facilities in the valley that are equipped to host a collegiate tournament. The proposed additions to the stadium would have to include a steeplechase, larger throw areas and a cage for the disc and shot put, and a hammer throw area. Due to drainage and water issues, the steeplechase has turned out to be more cost prohibitive than originally expected. Tom Spicer stated the University would like to pursue a collaborative effort towards funding the track and field additions, as they are currently in line to host the RMAC men's and women's track and field meet in spring of 2016, which could potentially bring 1,000 people to the community. Mr. Spicer stated the high schools and CMU would be able to share the new amenities and that the student athlete experience would drastically improve as it would provide the students the opportunity to train in a proper facility. Discussion

ensued regarding the reasoning for PIAB to fund the entire project when it appears the new amenities would only benefit "one" of the partners. Tom Spicer expressed bringing collegiate tournaments to Grand Junction would result in a positive economic impact on the community and requested the opportunity to bring forward a financial request once final project numbers have been received. Bruce Hill stated the proposal could be made at any of the scheduled quarterly PIAB meetings; however, if the University felt time was of the essence, a special meeting could also be requested. Donna Ross stated there could be other partners with future financial requests as well. Lena Elliott expressed the need for clarification regarding CMU's project priorities, stating the last three PIAB meetings have included conversations regarding the University's funding request for the west bleachers.

Rob Schoeber provided a brief update on the Lincoln Park tennis courts, stating they will be open for use on Friday.

Item 8: Adjourn

The meeting was adjourned at 1:05 p.m. by acclamation.
