

Event staff will monitor the sale and dispensing at both the ticket and drink booths to ensure compliance. Security officers, staff, and volunteers will observe attendee behavior to detect and address any alcohol-related concerns, maintaining a safe and controlled environment for all attendees.		
8. How will security personnel be identified? Security officers will be easily identifiable as they will be in uniform. The hired security personnel for the event is Citadel Security.

The beer garden & drink ticket booth will be enclosed by metal barricades marking the perimeter. Signage		
will be posted on the barricades stating "No Liquor Beyond This Point. Security personnel will be stationed at all access points to enforce liquor perimeter rules and ensure compliance throughout the event.






