(CDBG) PROGRAM

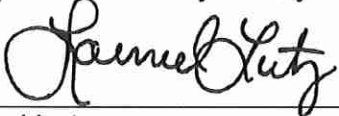
RECITALS.

The City of Grand Junction was designated by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) as an Entitlement Community in 1996. As an Entitlement Community, the City receives annual Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding and is required to prepare and maintain a Consolidated Plan to guide the use of those funds and related community development activities.

The Consolidated Plan is a federally required planning document that establishes a coordinated strategy for addressing housing, community development, and economic opportunity needs. The primary objective of the Consolidated Plan and the CDBG Program is to develop viable communities by providing decent housing, creating a suitable living environment, and expanding economic opportunities, principally for persons of low- and moderate-income.

The City undertook a comprehensive planning process to prepare the 2026–2030 Consolidated Plan, including citizen participation, interagency involvement, and coordination with nonprofit organizations, public agencies, and other stakeholders serving low-income and special-needs populations. Through this process, the City identified priority community needs and established goals, objectives, and strategies to guide community development investments and activities from 2026 through 2030.
