The City and the County have entered into a number of partnerships, both formal and informal, over the years. A list of those partnerships is being provided for review and discussion.

Background, Analysis and Options:

The City of Grand Junction and Mesa County cooperate in many ways for the betterment of the community. Some examples of that cooperation include the creation and support of a variety of jointly appointed boards, a number of services from animal control to the drainage authority to parks programming to purchasing, maintenance of facilities, communications and computer systems, a number of shared facilities (the employee parking garage is one example), to planning (like the Persigo Agreement), health (environmental), sewer service, and public safety and emergency services (probably the largest category). Most of the cooperative agreements are in formal written agreements, a few are authorized or mandated by State law, and there are a few that are verbal only.

Summary:

Interruptible Service Option Credit

Xcel Energy offers its large electrical consuming customers an incentive to participate in their Interruptible Service Option Credit (ISOC) program. An investment of \$735,572 will allow Persigo to purchase a generator and allow the City/County to participate in this program. In return the Persigo Facility will receive an annual credit of approximately \$105,000.

Wastewater Biogas used as Vehicle Fuel

Installation of specific equipment with an estimated cost of \$1,750,000 will allow gas produced at the Persigo Wastewater Treatment Facility to be used as vehicle fuel. Equipment needed includes gas conditioning and compression equipment to be located at the Persigo Treatment Facility and a dedicated pipeline from the Treatment Facility to the current Compressed Natural Gas Fueling Site. The current quantity of biogas being produced at Persigo is equivalent to 146,000 gallons of unleaded gasoline per year.

Background, Analysis and Options:

Interruptible Service Option Credit

During periods of peak demand, such as hot summer days, Xcel system customers may require more power than is normally available. As a means of reducing the demand, Xcel created the ISOC program. This program allows Xcel Energy to drop its larger energy consumers from the grid during these critical times. Interruptions are limited to a maximum of 160 hours per year.

Xcel customers throughout the State have made a considerable investment in this program. During 2011, 63 customers with 201 megawatts of generation capacity were participating. Their investment estimated at over one billion dollars provides security that the program will remain in place for some time. Xcel has budgeted \$28M in 2014 to pay the monthly ISOC credits. The ISOC program is a component of Xcel Energy's long

term Demand Side Management strategy to comply with House Bill 07-1037 that established cost-effective natural gas and electricity demand-side management programs that will save money for consumers and utilities and protect Colorado's environment. In order to take full advantage of the program and receive credits in 2014, the system needs to be operational prior to May 30, 2014.

Wastewater Biogas Used as Vehicle Fuel

Persigo currently produces methane gas as a by-product of its wastewater treatment operation. Currently a small portion of the gas is used for heating purposes and the remainder is "flared" or burned off. The quantity flared off on a daily basis has the equivalent BTU value of 400 gallons of gasoline.

The economics of taking "free" fuel and utilizing it as a vehicle fuel are obvious, not to mention the environmental benefits associated with using a clean fuel source. Early financial modeling shows the savings may be significant enough to pay back the initial infrastructure costs in as little as 10 years. This savings is over and above the savings the City is already experiencing in the CNG program. Users will still receive CNG fuel at a savings of over \$2.00 per gallon compared to the price of diesel fuel per gallon.

The greatest challenge this project presents is how to get the gas from Persigo to the CNG fueling site. Three different distribution methods have been identified. They include compressing the gas in high pressure vessels and trucking it to the current CNG fueling site; negotiating with Xcel Energy to utilize their gas distribution system in transporting the gas to the site; installing a dedicated pipeline from Persigo to the City Shops.

Trucking the gas was studied in detail by Johnson Controls as part of an Energy Efficiency Study conducted in 2009. It was determined that this option would not only be very expensive and labor intensive but would also negate the benefits of using CNG by burning diesel fuel to deliver it.

Negotiating with Xcel to utilize their distribution system has been studied by Xcel and City Staff over the past several years. This alternative proved to be more expensive than installing a dedicated pipeline and would require the City to perform extensive testing as an ongoing requirement of utilizing their system. In addition the City could be penalized for producing too much or too little gas.

It is Staff's opinion that the third option of installing a dedicated pipeline offers the best opportunity for transporting the gas from Persigo to the existing CNG filling site. This decision was made after thoroughly evaluating initial capital and ongoing costs associated with Xcel's requirements.

Financial Impact/Budget:

Interruptible Service Option Credit

\$735,572 will need to be appropriated in the 902 fund in the supplemental appropriation process to cover this cost. There is currently adequate funding however to proceed with the project.

The return on this investment, based on the ISOC agreement with Xcel, will be approximately seven years. From the payout forward the Persigo system will continue to receive \$105,000 per year for an unspecified time.

Wastewater Biogas to Vehicle Fuel.

Funding from this project will come from the Persigo Fund 904 in the way of a loan to the Fleet Internal Service fund. Since this project is not budgeted, a supplemental appropriation will be required later this year.

Legal issues:

The City Attorney will review the form and content of the agreement(s) for the ISOC.

Depending on the option selected for the biogas significant legal work will be required. The City Attorney and staff will assist the Persigo staff as required to ensure legal sufficiency and compliance of the project.

Previously presented or discussed:

The Biogas Project was discussed at a City Council Workshop on January 6th, 2014 as well as being mentioned at the last Annual Persigo Meeting on November 18, 2013. The ISOC Project was also mentioned at the November 18 Persigo Meeting.
