Item 2: Approval of Minutes

The January 2, 2014 minutes had an incorrect meeting date. Marc Litzen moved to approve the January 2, 2014 Parks and Recreation Advisory Board minutes with the necessary date change. Gary Schroen seconded. The minutes were approved unanimously.

Item 3: Matchett Park Update

Traci Wieland shared the Matchett Park Master Plan survey results, including the online survey, which received 1,199 responses, and the key pad polling that was held at the January 8, 2014 community meeting. (See attached) The Board members discussed the need to clarify some of the survey questions, including: clarification that trail use is non-motorized, refinement of the term "other" so it does not get confused with "none, possibly adding the question regarding likeliness of usage, and clarification of multi-purpose fields and their formality.

Discussion ensued, with the Board members expressing the polling system was a huge success by keeping the group engaged and organized, and that the survey results were very much in line with what was anticipated. Traci Wieland reported the next community open house is scheduled for Thursday, February 13, and will allow for more time in between the open house and presentations. The Board members were encouraged to attend and decided to schedule a "special" meeting for the following week to review the plans in detail.

Item 4: Las Colonias Park Update

The Las Colonias stakeholder's committee has unanimously decided to reapply for the recently declined GOCO grant. Staff has received feedback regarding the application, which included comments that the City's match was not high enough. The stakeholders have been re-approached requesting higher contributions, which resulted in over \$38,000 in funding (38.63% match). Discussion ensued regarding a PRAB group contribution towards the project, which will be discussed further at the special meeting. The grant application will be resubmitted in March, with an answer due in June.

The test channels have now been constructed and will be in place for a full year to allow for required water quality testing for the US Fish and Wildlife. If the test results are acceptable to US Fish and Wildlife, the full restoration project is scheduled to receive its "stamp of approval" in February 2015.

Item 5: Practice Field/Track Renovation

Rob Schoeber provided an update regarding CMU's request for improvements to the Lincoln Park track throwing area, which includes the shot put, discus, and hammer throw. The project was presented to the Parks Improvement Advisory Board last month, who approved a contribution of up to \$60,000. The throwing area improvements will provide CMU with the opportunity to host the RMAC men's and women's track and field meet in the spring of 2016, which could potentially bring 1,000 people to Grand Junction. The throwing area has now been fenced off in preparation of the construction. Staff is considering keeping the area fenced after the project has been completed in order to protect the new equipment. CMU is also discussing the possibility of a steeplechase in Lincoln Park, as the majority of the universities already have one.

Item 6: Stadium Concessionaire Update

The stadium concessionaire contract has been awarded to Brent Miller, owner of the Texas Food Company. Rob Schoeber stated Brent Miller was asked to provide concessions during the fall football season on very short notice and did an excellent job. Texas Food Company will be providing stadium concessions for 2014 baseball, track, JUCO, special events, and football season.

The Phase 1 component of the Matchett Park Master Plan included the following public engagement activities:

- 1. Open House Meeting Electronic Polling
- 2. Online Survey
- 3. Open House Meeting Dot Voting Exercise
- 4. Comment Cards and Email Comments

The following is a summary of the results of these activities.

It is important to note the demographic make-up present at the first open house, as this sample varies greatly with the larger population that has been providing information via the internet.

Open House #1

- We polled approximately 180 individuals
- 58% live directly adjacent or within walking distance of Matchett Park
- 62% were ages 51 or older

Online Poll

- The online survey collected responses from 1,199 people
- Less of the responses were from people living directly adjacent to the park, the majority of respondents were from people who live within Grand Junction but do not live within walking distance to the park (42%). 17% of respondents lived within walking distance to the park.
- A more diverse cross-section of age groups was represented with the majority from the 31-40 (28%) and 41-50 (24%) year old age groups.

Open House Electronic Polling (Attachment A)

The open house electronic polling revealed that the public is interested in a diversity of park recreational uses that are accessible to various user types, abilities, and ages. There was strong support for maintaining the existing natural qualities and quiet character of the park to include a diversity of trails. A community recreation center was also strongly supported, while this group

Informal, or flexible multipurpose, fields were supported more. The respondents showed interest in fitness areas, picnic areas, playgrounds, and outdoor performance space, amongst other passive uses. There was a split between those that wanted to see a dog park versus those who did not.

Given that this group is mostly from the neighborhood, there were also strong reactions to increased traffic and the routing of future roads, along with concerns with noise and vandalism. Overcrowding was also identified as an important issue.

Online Survey

The online survey aligned with responses from the electronic polling revealing support for a diversity of park recreational uses that are accessible to various user types, abilities, and ages. The facilities respondents feel are missing from the larger Grand Junction Parks and Recreation system included a community recreation center as well as passive areas to enjoy being in the outdoors. Respondents showed strong support for more passive recreational opportunities at Matchett Park in addition to amenities for families and children. In general, respondents were in favor of active recreation facilities for soccer, basketball and tennis as well as more informal activities such as fitness areas and an outdoor aquatic park. For the most, unlike the responses from the electronic polling, only a small percentage of participants were in opposition to organized league and informal active recreation facilities, with some greater opposition to the dirt jump bike park and skateboard/inline skate park. There was strong support across the board for all of the passive recreation uses at Matchett Park with little opposition for passive uses. Similar to the electronic survey, there was both support and opposition for a dog park with 31% of survey respondents against and 54% in favor of this use.

Managing vandalism, traffic and overcrowding were the most important issues to manage with the development of Matchett Park. Parking was thought to be best accommodated in medium sized lots that are dispersed throughout the park and are proportionate to each use. In both the electronic and online surveys, the preference for the park's aesthetic character was to emphasize the natural context.

Open House Meeting Dot Voting Exercise (Attachment B)

A summary of the open house dot voting exercise is attached here. The strongest support for activities came for pickleball, skateboarding, swimming, disc golf, trails, a community recreation center, and basic park facilities (restrooms). The public was also allowed to post comments or add ideas to this exercise, and some of those ideas include an arboretum, art, open space, and more voicing of traffic concerns.

Comment Cards/Email Comments

The comments received were primarily gathered at the first public open house, totaling 49 returned to us and eight individuals emailing their thoughts, ideas, and concerns. In assessing the comments, the following programmatic elements emerged as important from this group:

- trails (approx. 21)
- recreation/community center (approx. 11)
- skateboard park (approx. 10)
- keeping Matchett in its natural state (approx. 11)
