

Grand Junction Colo Feb 6<sup>th</sup> 1888

Board met at the usual hour with the mayor and the following members present at roll call,

J. W. Bridges, H. K. Rea, J. J. Lumsden, J. H. Scovill <sup>and</sup> A. F. Paff  
Minutes previous meetings read and on motion approved.

A petition from lot owners on the north side of Block 104 was presented, read and on motion the following resolution adopted after having been put upon its passage with the following affirmative vote.

J. W. Bridges yes H. K. Rea yes J. H. Scovill yes F. H. Hadcock yes  
A. F. Paff yes J. J. Lumsden yes.

Whereas in the opinion of the Board it is necessary to construct a sidewalk in front of the hereinafter described lots; therefore be it ordered that a sidewalk four feet wide, consisting of 2 inch plank - 12 feet long; resting on sleepers or bents every four feet, be constructed in front of lots numbered 1 to 16 in block 104 in the town of Grand Junction.

On motion the Recorder was instructed to communicate with Wm. Ridgeway in regard to building a sidewalk from the Depot to a connection with the present sidewalk on 2nd St. the board agreeing to put the same in good repair up to Main St.  
Reports of Police Magistrate and the Town Treasurer were read and on motion accepted and ordered placed on file.
