

Grand Junction Colo Sep 5th 1887

Meeting called to order with the following members of the Board present to wit; H. S. Pea, S. J. Scovill, A. F. Puff, J. J. Linsuden and J. P. Sweeney Mayor, The Recorder being absent L. A. Staley was elected Recorder pro tem. The petition of Muncy & Ryan to have their Retail Liquor License transferred to George Ryan was read and on motion granted.

The Report of the Police Magistrate presented read and on motion accepted and ordered filed. The Report of the Street Commissioners presented read discussed and on motion accepted and ordered filed. The following bills were then read and on motion allowed and Recorder ordered to draw warrants for the same.

Bill of Hynes and Kennedy referred to the Finance Committee, On motion the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants for the amounts due City Officers, for month of August, Committee on Water Works presented the report of A. J. McCune as to distance, fluming and piping to conduct water from White Water Creek and reported progress, Report accepted and Committee continued.
