

Grand Junction Colo  
May 5<sup>th</sup> 1887

Board met pursuant to adjournment.

Present at roll call, = A. F. Paff, J. J. Lumsden, S. J. Scoville and H. H. Rea. Minutes previous meeting read and approved

Committee on Streets, Alleys & bridges reported the following resolution to wit.

Whereas, in the opinion of the Board of Trustees, the flow of water along the gutters on either side of Main St, between 6<sup>th</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> streets is in the present condition of said gutters dangerous to the foundation of buildings fronting on such portion of said Main Street. Therefore be it ordered that said gutters on each side of Main Street between 6<sup>th</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> be boxed or flumed in the manner following to wit; Said boxes or flumes to be constructed as follows; The bottom to be of two inch plank, 14 inches wide jointed on edges, The sides to be of 2 inch planks, ten inches wide, securely spiked to the bottom plank with 30 d spikes. The upper side of flume to be left open, but stayed with braces consisting of 2x4 timber, every four feet. The ends of the sections of flume to be fitted and matched together in a manner known as a three inch bevel lap and securely nailed and all to be done in a workmanlike manner. The lumber used to be of pine reasonably free from knots, and to be laid in place under the direction of the Marshall, and that the cost thereof be assessed against the lots and parcels of land fronting thereon in the manner provided by ordinance.

On motion the above resolution was adopted the following being the result of the vote,

A. F. Paff, J. J. Lumsden, S. J. Scoville, H. H. Rea voting yes, Committee on Finance reported favorably on the bill of Edwin Price and on motion the bill allowed as presented and Recorder ordered to draw warrant on the Treasurer for the same, Bill of Rice Boos, on motion referred to Committee on Finance,

On motion the Recorder was instructed to notify the lumber dealers that the Board invited them to make bids for furnishing lumber to the city for three months from May 12<sup>th</sup> 87

An Ordinance, entitled an Ordinance, Amending Article 83 of Chapter 9 of the Revised Ordinances of 1884, of the Town of Grand Junction, was then introduced and on motion put on its passage. The yeas and nays being called with the following result, A. F. Paff, J. J. Lumsden, H. H. Rea, S. J. Scoville voting yes. On motion Board then adjourned to meet Thursday May 12<sup>th</sup> 1887 at 7.30 o'clock
