A Request from J. P. McFarland requesting the Board to cause a crossing on Main Street at the Commercial Bank corner was on motion laid on table.

A motion was made second and carried to instruct the Recorder to give notice if there would be held a general election held on the 5th day of April 1887 at the Council Room in the Town Jail at Grand Junction held.

A Motion was made second and carried.

That the trees in the Park shall be planted 12 1/2 ft apart bottomwood trees to smooth bark slight vigorous and thrifty and to be 1 to 2 in. in diameter above the ground and to be cut back 6 ft in uniform height. The main body of the tree shall not fall below 5 ft. If other than bottomwood trees are used they shall be well balanced vigorous and thrifty. Ranging from 4 1/2 to 6 ft in height. At the same distance

apart as the locustwood trees ^{and} in accordance with the plans ^{and}
 specifications of the Engineer. All trees to be felled by the
 4th day of April 1887. ^{Release all trees that die at his own expense the first 75% of} The contractor is to receive 75% of his
 bill as soon as the trees are set out and certified to by
 the Engineer. ^{and} the last 25% to be paid one year later
 when all dead trees are replanted.

A motion was made seconded ^{and} carried that all bids
 for setting out the Park in trees must be handed in
 by Saturday Mar 12th 87
^{on motion the Superintendent was instructed to ~~then~~ clean out & repave the street crossings}
 on motion the clerk was instructed to draw warrants for
 salaried officers for month of February.
 on motion the board then adjourned to meet March 12 1887.
