

Grand Junction to adv.  
March 15<sup>th</sup> 1887

Board met Pursuant to adjournment at 7:30 P.M.

Present at Roll call.

James W. Bucklin Mayor. W. J. Carpenter John Stynes.  
J. T. Sharp Trustees. L. A. Sibley atty. W. J. Quinn Recorder.

Board proceeded to open bids received from  
Joseph Reither. R. Bygnow. Joseph Henry. J. A. K. Hornford.  
and Felix Toupain, for erection board fence around bottom  
wood park. The bid of Joseph Reither being the lowest,  
the contract on motion was awarded to Joseph Reither  
at a cost of one hundred and five dollars (\$105.00) <sup>more</sup>  
in "Town warrants"

The yeas and nays being called with the following  
result. W. J. Carpenter yes. John Stynes yes. J. T. Sharp yes. <sup>Trustees</sup>

James W. Bucklin yes Mayor.

Petition of John Woughn. asking permission to erect a  
frame building on lot 3 in block 119. was on motion  
granted.

An ordinance "entitled an ordinance" concerning  
Town officers. was then introduced, and on motion was  
placed on its passage.

The yeas and nays was then called with the following  
result.

J. T. Sharp yes. W. J. Carpenter yes. John Stynes yes. Trustees.  
James W. Bucklin yes Mayor.

A motion was made seconded and carried that a comm-  
-ittee of three, consisting of John McArthur, P. B. to H. Esen, and  
L. A. Sibley, be appointed in behalf of the Town of Grand  
Junction to settle with the County Treasurer, beginning with  
the year 1883 and settle up to date. The committee to receive  
a compensation of Seven dollars <sup>each</sup> per day. (\$700) and report  
basis of settlement to board of Trustees for the Town of  
Grand Junction and if any of the above named committee  
failed to act. The Mayor is authorized to appoint one  
to fill the vacancy.

Board then adjourned to meet Tuesday March 29<sup>th</sup> 1887  
at 7:30 P.M.
