

Grand Junction Colorado April 28th 1886.

Board met pursuant to adjournment.

The following members and officers were present and answered at Roll Call

Proposition from Martin Florida to furnish water for the Town of Grand Junction
 for two years was presented to the Board, and after some discussion the Water Com-
 mittee was instructed to wait on George A. Crawford and offer him \$300⁰⁰ per
 year for a term of three years to furnish water for the Town of Grand Junction
 and if he refused to contract for water at that price the City Attorney be and hereby is
 instructed to draw up a contract with Martin Florida in accordance with the
 terms in his proposition to furnish water for the Town.

CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS.

APRIL 28. — Proposition of Martin Florida to furnish water for the town of Grand Junction for two years was presented to the board. After discussion the water committee was instructed to wait on Geo. A. Crawford and offer him \$300 a year for water for a term of three years, and in case he refused to so contract, the city attorney was instructed to draw up a contract with Martin Florida, in accordance with the terms of his proposition.

MAY 2. — Report of Treasurer Marsh for the month ending April 30th was read and approved.

Committee, consisting of George M. Huskins and John McArthur, reported on the condition of treasurer's books.

Petition of M. J. Farrell, for rebate of license, was granted.

Recorder was instructed to draw warrants for monthly salaries.

City attorney was ordered to prepare an ordinance for the purpose of submitting to a vote of the people a proposition to issue water bonds to the amount of \$10,000, to be expended in boring artesian wells.

City attorney was ordered to draw contract for water with the Pacific Slope Ditch Company, and the mayor was authorized to sign the contract for the town: price, \$400 for 100 inches, for one year.
