

Grand Junction Colorado May 3rd 1886

Board met at 7³⁰ O'clock A.M.

The following members were present at Roll call.

Edwin Rice, D. S. Dickie, J. V. Sharp, John Heynes, W. J. Carpenter, Trustees James N. Bucklin Mayor F. A. Staley Attorney Geo. M. Heuckline Recorder.

Minutes of proceeding meeting read and approved.

Report of City Treasurer for month ending April 30th 1886, was read and on motion was approved and ordered filed.

Report of Committee appointed by the Board to examine the books of the outgoing City Treasurer was read and ordered filed.

Committee on water reported that they had waited on Geo. A. Crawford, and that he refused the proposition to furnish water for the Town for three years for the sum of \$30000 per year.

Communication from Mr. J. Barrell asking that the Board abate the license on his second hand store was read, and on motion said license was abated.

The following bills against the Town were allowed and the Clerk and Recorder instructed to draw warrants on the City Treasurer for same.

Bill for \$15000 in favor of M. W. Smith for right of way of Street to State Bridge was referred to Committee on Streets.

On motion the Clerk and Recorder was instructed to draw warrants for the salaried officers.
On motion the City Attorney was instructed to prepare an Ordinance for the purpose of submitting to a vote of the people a proposition to issue bonds to the amount of \$10,000⁰⁰ for the fur-

issue of securing permanent water for the town.

Moved and seconded that the City Attorney be instructed to draw Contract with the Pacific Slope Ditch Co to furnish 100 inches of water for the town during the year 1886. for the sum of \$400⁰⁰ payable in Town Warrants, and the Mayor be authorized to sign the same on the part of the Town.
