

Grand Junction Colo.  
April 14<sup>th</sup> 1887.

Board met pursuant to adjournment. Called to order by A. F. Paff Mayor pro tem.

Minutes of last meeting read and on motion approved. Committee on Pound reported that a lot could be leased from Town Co. On motion the report was accepted and said committee instructed to construct a Pound. Committee on main Street-ditches, reported that they had conversed with some of the property holders in regard to boxing Main Street ditches, and most of them were in favor of paying for the boxing. On motion the report was accepted and committee discharged. On motion City Attorney was instructed to prepare and present, at next regular meeting of the Board an ordinance compelling property owners on Main St. between Sixth and Third Streets, to place boxes in front of their property to run the water through. On motion the committee on Water was instructed to over-look the course in which N. N. Smith and others desired the water to flow, taken from Seventh Street; and report at next meeting. On motion Recorder was instructed to draw warrants to the amt. of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) in favor of the Pacific Slope ditch Co.

An Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance <sup>repealing Sec (1) of an ordinance</sup> concerning the salary of Town Recorder", passed by the Board of Trustees, April 8<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1886 by and the same is hereby repealed. was introduced and on motion adopted.

Then the following Resolution was introduced and on motion was adopted.

Whereas there is no resolution ordinance of the town, fixing the compensation of the Recorder,  
Be it Resolved - That the salary of the Recorder be fixed at the sum of Fifteen - Dollars per month.

On motion the Marshall and Street Commissioner was instructed to purchase supplies for Town, from each and

every Business House, making a fair division of Town funds.

On motion Board adjourned to meet Monday Evening April 18<sup>th</sup> 1887
