

Grand Junction Colo.
August 8th 1888.

The Board met pursuant to adjournment at 8 O'clock P. M. -
then were present at roll call. Mayor Lawrence and Trustees
Haddock, Lumsden, Rea, Roberts and Seville - Absent trustee Hynes.
The minutes of the meetings of July 23rd and August 6th 1888, were
read and approved.

The reports of the town Treasurer and Police Magistrate for the month
of July were read and on motion accepted and ordered filed.

The Chairman of the Finance Committee made a verbal report
recommending that a warrant for \$490 be issued to R. C. Fletcher
to reimburse him for license tax erroneously assessed and paid by
him. On motion the report was accepted and the Recorder ordered
to issue said warrant.

The following bills were then read and on motion were
referred to the Finance Committee.

W. H. Karkhorn - work on streets for 5⁰⁰
+ F. P. Brown - Medical services for 3⁰⁰

allowed and warrants ordered issued in payment of the same.

and the last two bills were ordered to be charged up to the a/c of the
party furnishing water for the town & to be deducted from the annual rental
of \$400⁰⁰

It was then moved seconded & carried, that the Marshal be instructed
and empowered to employ the necessary help to clean out the

ditches, and repair and fill holes in the street, on Rood Avenue
between 6th & 7th Streets.

On Motion the Marshal was instructed to cause Cottonwood Park
to be plowed; provided the cost shall not exceed ten dollars.

The Board then adjourned to meet August 13th 1888 at 8 O'clock P.M.
