

Grand Junction Colo. June 3rd 1887

Regular meeting of the Board. Present at roll call Mayor Phone. Trustees Adams, Crosby, Pardue, Sharp  
Minutes of Special Meetings of May 9th and 11th were read and approved.

A petition was presented for the construction of a new sidewalk on the north side of Colorado Avenue between 2nd and 3rd Streets along and in front of Block 1205, signed by W D Hammond and other lot owners.

The yeas and nays were then called for on the adoption of the following resolution with the following result, Trustees voting were Adams yea, Pardue yea, Crosby yea Sharp yea. "Whereas in the opinion of the Board of Trustees it is necessary that a new sidewalk be constructed along and in front of lots 17 to 32 inclusive in Block 1205. Therefore be it ordered that a sidewalk such as provided by Ordinance except that it be ten feet wide be constructed in front of said lots under the provisions of Ordinances concerning sidewalks."

Report of Town Treasurer for month of May was presented and on motion referred to finance Committee.

Report of Police Magistrate for May was presented and on motion accepted. Trustees Bliss and Whitehead then appeared and took their seats.

Report of the Committee to look up a Pound Site was presented with recommendations that the Board appropriate the sum of \$2000 to fix up the King.

Blacksmith Speer now leased by J A Hunt.  
 On motion the report was adopted and Committee discharged  
 The committee on streets and alleys recommended that new  
 crossings be put in from 4th to 7th Streets  
 Motion made and carried that the matter be referred  
 to above Committee with power to act.

The following Bids were then received for the team work  
 for the town springing year.  
 By J A Hunt at \$4<sup>50</sup>/<sub>100</sub> per day and furnish wagons and  
 wheel scraper when necessary. By W W Wolf for \$3<sup>75</sup>/<sub>100</sub>  
 cash per day. By J O Bennett at \$3<sup>90</sup>/<sub>100</sub>. By W D Hammond  
 at \$3<sup>75</sup>/<sub>100</sub> team & man per day. By B K Kennedy at \$4<sup>00</sup>/<sub>100</sub>  
 per day and furnish scrapers and plows, also haul horse Cart  
 to fires. Motion made by Whitehead that the bid of  
 B K Kennedy be accepted. The yeas and nays were called  
 for with the following result. Trustees voting were  
 Adams yea, Crosby yea Bliss yea Pardue nay Sharp  
 yea Whitehead yea. Motion carried.

Report of St Leon for May presented and on motion  
 accepted. Bond of Street Commissioner with Geo A Crawford  
 and P H Badcock as sureties presented and approved.

Motion made and carried that the Town Engineer establish  
 a water grade for the Ditch flume on each side of Main  
 Street between 3rd and 6th Streets and that the Street Com  
 be instructed to put the same in repair.

It appearing that A J McLeune Town Engineer elect  
 refuses to qualify on motion the yeas and nays were called  
 on election of Frank McBlintock in his place, with the following  
 result Trustees voting were Adams yea Bliss yea Crosby yea  
 Sharp yea Pardue yea Whitehead yea. McBlintock was declared  
 elected town Engineer.

Mr Bliss requested that the south  
 side of the Alley between Main and Road Streets from 4th  
 to 5th Streets be boxed or flumed on a water grade.

On motion the matter was referred to committee on streets  
 and alleys with power to act.

The following proposition was presented and read  
 Grand Junction Colo

June 3rd 1889  
 To the City Council of Grand Junction  
 Gentlemen.

I hereby propose to plow the  
 City Park & seed it to blue grass, lawn grass and white  
 clover & keep the same irrigated during the period of one  
 year from this date for the sum of Two Hundred  
 Dollars. Payments to be made as follows, fifty  
 Dollars to be paid to me July 1st 1889, fifty Dollars  
 on August 1st 1889, and one hundred Dollars on June

1st 1890 after the work shall have been accepted by the Council  
 All payments subject to the approval of the City Council,  
 Provided however that I will not be responsible for  
 irrigation if the town of Grand Junction should fail to have  
 water in its ditches. I further propose to gravel the walks  
 in said park as now laid out for the sum of one hundred  
 Dollars to be paid for when accepted, Walks to be three  
 feet wide.

 the walks," with the following result Trustees voting  
 were Adams yea Bliss yea Crosby yea Sharp yea,  
 Pardue yea Whitehead yea,

Motion made and carried that the Finance committee make  
 an estimate of the cost of Books and Stationery required by the  
 Recorder and Mayor Treasurer. The Police Magistrate  
 was also authorized to procure a Docket Book.

Motion made and carried that the Street Commissioner  
 open 7th St from South St to the St south of the  
 Flouring Mill and extend the Ditches on said St to  
 connect with the Dayton Ditch.

Motion made and carried that the Mayor have  
 full power to attend to the small fox matter  
 Board then adjourned
