

Grand Junction Colo
Jan 7th 1890

Board met in Special Session at 7³⁰ o'clock Pm

Present Adams Mayor, Trustees Welf, Pardue
Crosby, Hynes and Whitehead.

The following Bills were then allowed

A petition was presented for the construction of a
four foot sidewalk on West side of 5th St from
White St to Chipeta St

The yeas and nays were then called for on the
adoption of the following Resolution with the following
result Trustees voting were Welf yea Pardue yea
Crosby yea, Hynes yea Whitehead yea.

Whereas in the opinion of the Board of Trustees
it is necessary that a new sidewalk be constructed
along the West side of 5th Street from White St
to Chipeta St. Therefore be it ordered that a new
sidewalk such as provided by Ordinance except it
be four feet wide, be constructed along and in front
of said lots under the provisions of Ordinances
concerning Sidewalks.

Motion made and carried that the Board advertise
for Bids for the construction of a Hoose House
and Town Hall as per plans and Specifications
now on file.

On Motion a Ballot was then taken for
Trustee to fill vacancy caused by the election of
Orson Adams Jr Mayor, which resulted in John
Reeder receiving five votes and he was declared
elected Trustee.

On Motion the Marshal was instructed to
notify the owner of the adobe building on Colorado
Avenue near the Unawep House, to remove same.

On Motion the Board then adjourned
to Wednesday evening Jan 15th at 7³⁰ o'clock Pm
