Feb 3rd 1870

Regular meeting of the Board at 7³⁰ o'clock P.M.

Present Mayor Adams and Trustees Pardue
Brosby, Keynes and Wolf.

Minutes of last regular and special meetings
read and approved.

Reports of Treasurer and Police Mag for month of
Jan read and approved.

The following petitions for the construction of new
sidewalks were presented and read, "along the east end
of Block 104 and the West end of Block 105 from main St
to Road St and along lot 21 Blk 83 to Grand Avenue"

"On North side of Block 125 and 126 "

"also on north side of Colorado Avenue from 5th St to
7th St." "From S E corner of Blk 57 along west side
of 6th St to lot 17 Block 29 "

The yeas and nays were then called for on the adoption
of the following resolution with the following result
Trustees voting ~~for~~ were Brosby yea Pardue yea
Wolf - yea Keynes yea " Whereas in the opinion of
the Board of Trustees it is necessary that a new sidewalk
be constructed along and in front of the lots as described
in said petitions: Therefore be it ordered that a new sidewalk

such as provided by ordinance except it be four feet wide ~~be~~
only on north side Colo Ave from 5th to 7th St six feet wide, and north side of Blks 125 & 126 eight ft
wide constructed along and in front of said lots under the provisions
of Ordinances concerning sidewalks.

The yeas and nays were also called for on the adoption
of the following resolution with the following result, Trustees
voting for were Brosby yea Pardue yea Keynes yea Wolf
yea. Whereas in the opinion of the Board it is necessary that
a new sidewalk be constructed along and in front of the lots
on the South side of Grand Avenue from 1st St to 7th St,

Therefore be it ordered that a new sidewalk such as
provided by Ordinance except it be four feet wide be
constructed along and in front of said lots under the
provisions of Ordinances concerning sidewalks.

The committee appointed to examine the foundation
of the Jail reported and recommended that the old wall
on South end be removed and new foundation and wall be
put in also that a new foundation be put in under
the North end. Report adopted.

Bids were then received for construction of Street
crossings and sidewalks and the Bid of David E Nelson
being the lowest motion made that he be awarded the
contract the yeas and nays being called for

with the following result Trustees voting for were Crosby year
Half-year. Hynes year. Pardue year,

On motion the Recorder was instructed to advertise
for bids for graveling 1st and 2nd Sts from the Depot to Main St
and Main St and Colorado Avenue from 1st to both Sts,

Bids to be received until Feb 8th 1890 at 6 o'clock PM

Motion made and carried that Mr Heisen be notified
to repair the building on lot 6 Blk 118 or remove same

On motion McDonald Pardue was appointed a Com
to Superintend the construction of the Horse house and jail,
and to receive compensation therefor.

Board then adjourned to Feb 8th 1890, at 7³⁰
