

Grand Junction Colo
Feb 18. 1870

Board met pursuant to adjournment at 7:30 o'clock PM
Present Mayor Adams and Trustees Wolf
Crosby, Pardue and Keynes,

A Petition was presented for the construction of
the following sidewalk, and the yeas and nays were
called for on the following Resolution with the following
result. Trustees voting were Crosby yeas Wolf yeas
Pardue yeas Keynes yeas.

Whereas in the opinion of the Board it is necessary
that a new sidewalk be constructed along and in
front of lots 1 and 2 in Block 117. Therefore
be it ordered that a new sidewalk such as provided
by Ordinance except it be ten feet wide be constructed
along and in front of said lots under the Ordinances
concerning sidewalks.

On motion the Mayor was authorized to employ
an Engineer when required.

On motion the Recorder was instructed to
draw a warrant in the sum of \$250 to the

Cameron Keese Co No 1, for supplies.

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Bill of Grand Junction Water Co presented and referred to City Attorney.

The yeas and Nays were called for on the following resolution with the following result,
 Trustees voting for were Crosby yea Purdue yea Wolf yea Hayes yea. Resolved that W. C. Hammond be allowed $2\frac{1}{2}$ cents more per yard for gravel making $66\frac{1}{2}$ cents per yard it being understood that he was to receive 64 cents per yd in cash or its equivalent.

On motion Trustee Purdue was instructed to ascertain the cost of the extra work necessary to be done on the Keese House & Jail and have power to act.

Motion made and carried that the Mayor telegraph to the Commissioner of the General Land Office and request that the Patent to original Entry on town site issue at once.
