

Grand Junction Colo  
March 5<sup>th</sup> 1890

Board met pursuant to adjournment at 7 o'clock PM  
Present Mayor Protem Jos Crosby and  
Trustees Pardue, Wolf, Hynes,

The yeas and nays were called for on the  
passage and adoption of the following Ordinance with  
the following result Trustees voting were Hynes yea  
Pardue yea Wolf yea Crosby yea.

"An Ordinance providing for the submission to the  
qualified electors of the town of Grand Junction the proposition  
to pay the mayor and members of the Board of Trustees  
five dollars for each regular meeting, not to exceed a  
total sum of fifty dollars per annum,

Ordinance declared passed and adopted,

The yeas and nays were also called for on the  
adoption of an Ordinance to regulate the use of water  
from hydrants, with the following result Trustees  
voting were Crosby yea Wolf yea Pardue yea,  
Hynes yea. Ordinance declared passed and adopted,

On motion the Street Commissioner was instructed  
to open 7<sup>th</sup> Street to the north limits of the town,  
providing the right of way was secured without cost  
to the town.

Motion made and carried that the Recorder draw a  
warrant on the Treas for \$1500 in favor of M. A. B. &  
Arman on City Hall & Hose House Contract.

On motion H. B. Dayton R. P. Abbey & Fred Halbauer  
were appointed Judges of Election for the next ensuing  
election, and fixed the office of H. B. Dayton as the place  
of voting,

Board then adjourned to Mch 10<sup>th</sup> at 7<sup>30</sup>  
o'clock PM.
