

Grand Junction, Colo.
August 17th 1890.

Regular meeting of the Board, at 9 o'clock A. M.

Present Mayor Bradish, and Trustees Miller, Hammond,
Crosby and Snyder.

Minutes of last regular and adjourned meetings read and
approved.

C. H. Baldwin, Recorder being absent, James W. Bucklin
was elected Recorder pro tem.

Monthly reports of Treasurer and Police Magistrate presented
and on motion approved, and ordered placed on file.

On motion Company "A" and "B" were permitted to store their
fire-arms in the Marshal office at their own responsibility and expense.

Motion made and carried instructing the Marshal to strictly
enforce the ordinances requiring the gutters and out houses to
be kept clean.

The following Resolution was adopted by a vote as follows;
Trustees voting were Miller yea, Hammond yea, Crosby yea and Snyder
yea.

Whereas in the opinion of a two-thirds majority of all the
members of the Board of Trustees it is necessary that a new side-
walk be constructed in front of lots 17 and 18 in Block 146, and along and in
front of the East side of lot 17 in Block 146, and along and in front of the
West side of lots 1 and 32 in Block 98, and in front of lots 1, 2, 3 and 4, 29, 30, 31
and 32 in Block 79, and in front of lot 27 in Block 142, and in front of lots
31 and 32 Block 141, and in front of lots 17, 18, 19, 20, 21 and 22 in Block 60, and in front
of and along the East side of lot 16 in Block 60, and in front and along
the side of the East side of lots 16 and 17 in Block 38, and in front of lots
5, 6, 7 and 8 in Block 82, and in front and along the East side of lots 17 in
Block 82, ~~and in front of lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 in Block 116;~~ and in front of and along the
East side of lots 16 and 17 in Block 147, and along and in front of the West
side of lot 1 in Block 138, and in front of lots 11, 12 and 13 in Block
149, and in front of lots 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 19 and 20 in Block 127, and in
front of lots 8, 9, 10, and 28 in Block 93, and in front of lots 4 and 5 in
Block 82, and in front of lots 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 in Block 49, and in front of
lots 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 in Block 27, and in front of lot 24 in Block 70, and
in front of lots 20 and 21 in Block 92, and in front of lots 24, 25, 26, 27,
28, 30, 31 and 32 in Block 91. Therefore be it ordered that a sidewalk
such as described by ordinance, except that it be four feet wide
instead of twelve feet wide be constructed along said described
lots under the provision of the ordinance concerning sidewalks.

And whereas in the opinion of a two-thirds majority of all the
members of the Board of Trustees it is necessary that a new side-
walk be constructed in front of lots 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 in Block
96, and in front of lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 in Block 97, and
along and in front of the East side of lot 16 in Block 142, and in front
of lot 16 in Block 116. Therefore be it ordered that a sidewalk such

as described by ordinance, except that it be six feet wide instead of twelve feet wide, be constructed along said described lots under the provisions of the ordinances concerning sidewalks.

And whereas in the opinion of a two-thirds majority of all the members of the Board of Trustees it is necessary that a new sidewalk be constructed in front of ^{2d} along the East side of Lots 12nd 13 in Block 122 ^{2d} and along ^{2d} in front of the East side of Lots 16nd 17 in Block 120, ^{2d} ^{in front of lot 14 in Block 120} therefore be it ordered that a sidewalk such as described by ordinance, except that it be eight feet wide instead of twelve feet wide, be constructed along said described lots under the provisions of the ordinances concerning sidewalks.

And whereas in the opinion of a two-thirds majority of all the members of the Board of Trustees it is necessary that a new sidewalk be constructed along ^{2d} in front of the East side of Lots 16nd 17 in Block 119, ^{2d} in front of lot 21 in Block 119, ^{2d} and along ^{2d} in front of the East side of Block 95. Therefore be it ordered that a sidewalk such as described by ordinance, except that it be ten feet wide instead of twelve feet wide, be constructed along said described Lots ^{2d} and Block under the provisions of the ordinances concerning sidewalks.
