

Grand Junction Colo
Nov 24th 1890

Board met pursuant to adjournment.

Present Mayor Bradish and Trustees Miller
Cannon, Dulmaine, Hammond and Crosby.

The yeas and nays were called on an Ordinance
repealing an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to authorize
the erection construction and operation of a plant or plants
for the generation and transmission of electricity light
power or any other purpose and for the operation of
Telephone lines &c." passed and adopted the 31st
day of October 1890, the result of said vote being
as follows. Trustees voting were Cannon yea Crosby
yea Miller yea Hammond yea Dulmaine yea,
Ordinance passed and adopted.

The yeas and nays were called for on adoption of
"An Ordinance to authorize the erection construction and
operation of a plant or plants for the generation and
transmission of electricity for light power or any other
purpose; for the operation of telephone lines; for the
manufacture of ice and refrigerant and the conveyance
and transmission of such refrigerant and for the
generation of steam and its conveyance and transmission
for heating or power purposes in the town of Grand
Junction Colorado." with the following result
Trustees voting were Cannon yea Miller yea Crosby
yea Hammond yea Dulmaine yea
Ordinance passed and adopted

Certificate of Street Commissioner on the
construction and cost of sidewalks in front of certain
lots was presented and approved, and on motion the
Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant to
each of the following persons in payment of the

Construction of same in the following sums to wit:
J H Nelson \$55.09 Felix Dupain \$24.75 and to
S P Butshall \$245.47

The yeas and nays were then called on the following
Resolution and it was passed by the following vote.
Trustees voting were Lamson yeas Miller yeas Crosby yeas
Hammond yeas Dulmaine yeas.

constructed along the west side of 5th Street from
S.E. corner of Blk 162 to the State Bridge

Therefore be it ordered that a sidewalk
such as provided by Ordinance, except it be 6 feet
wide, be constructed along the west side of 5th St as
aforesaid under the provisions of Ordinances concerning
sidewalks.
