

Grand Junction Colo
March 30th 1891

Board met pursuant to adjournment

Present Mayor Bradish and Trustees Crosby
Canon, Hammond, Miller, Dulmaine

A notice from The Grand Junction Telephone & Electric
light Co, that they released the town from its former Contract
for Electric lights was filed and accepted.

The yeas and nays were then called for on the
adoption of the following Resolution with the following
result Trustees voting were Canon yea Crosby yea
Hammond yea Miller yea, Dulmaine yea.

Resolved, that at the regular annual election of Officers
of the Town (City) of Grand Junction, on to-wit, the Seventh
day of April A.D. 1891, there be submitted to such of the
qualified electors of said town (City) as shall, in the
year next preceeding said election have paid a property
tax therein, the question of creating a bonded indebtedness
of \$11400.00 for the purpose of paying said City's
proportion of the cost of constructing a system of
Sewerage for said ^{City}. Said Bonds to be due and payable
in not less than ten nor more than fifteen years and to
bear 7% interest per annum. Those voting in favor of
creating said bonded indebtedness shall cast a ballot
in a separate ballot box on which shall be written
or printed the words "For Sewer Bonds", and those
voting against creating said bonded indebtedness
shall cast a ballot on which shall be written or
printed the words "Against Sewer Bonds".

Resolution passed.

J. D. McLeane then presented plans, specifications
and estimates for a system of Sewerage which
was filed and his Bill for services as Engineer
\$250 was allowed.

W. R. Barton ^{Bill} was allowed \$400 for
coal.

Board then adjourned
