

Grand Junction Colorado

City Council of the City of Grand Junction April 20th 1891

at a ^{qualified} adjournment, Mayor Elect L. M. Miller and Alderman elect, M. L. Allison, C. C. Bower, E. W. Gannon, J. G. Hall, W. H. Lee, L. W. Morris, Geo. Ryan and D. P. Stetzelberger being present they took the required oath of office.

The Alderman of the several wards then cast lots for the long and short term, with the following result.

- 1st Ward Long term Geo. Ryan, Short term F. W. Morris
- 2nd " " " " W. H. Lee " " J. G. Hall
- 3rd " " " " D. P. Stetzelberger " " M. L. Allison
- 4th " " " " C. C. Bower " " E. W. Gannon

E. W. Gannon was elected President of the City Council. Official bond of City Treasurer elect Frank Haskell was accepted and approved.

Applications for appointments to city offices within the gift of the City Council were presented, and on motion lain over until the next meeting of the Council.

On motion City Council adjourned until 7.30 P.M.

7.30 P.M. City Council met pursuant to adjournment Present Mayor L. M. Miller, Alderman M. L. Allison, C. C. Bower, E. W. Gannon, J. G. Hall, W. H. Lee, L. W. Morris, Geo. Ryan and D. P. Stetzelberger

City Council proceeded to the election of City officers, a ballot was then taken for City Clerk with the following result, B. F. Jay received five votes, Geo. Smith two votes, and Will Crawford one vote, B. F. Jay having received a majority of the votes was declared duly elected City Clerk.

Ballot was then taken for City Attorney as follows J. W. Bucklin six votes, L. W. Wheeler 2 votes, J. M. Burklin having received a majority of the votes cast, was declared duly elected City Attorney.

Ballot was then taken for Police Magistrate with the following result, S. G. McShallen 5 votes, Geo. B. Taylor 3 votes, S. G. McShallen having received a majority of the votes cast was declared duly elected Police Judge.

Ballot was then taken for City Marshal, Geo. R. Barton received 3 votes, and was declared duly elected City Marshal.

Ballot was then taken for Policeman, James Cummins received 5 votes, Reagan 2 votes

and Levi 1 vote James Cummings having received a majority of the votes was declared duly elected Policeman

Ballot was then taken for Street Commissioners

Phelix Loupain received 5 votes Wharton 3 and Whitley 1

Phelix Loupain having received a majority of all votes cast was declared duly elected Street Commissioner.

On motion the Mayor was instructed to declare D. R. Crosby elected City Engineer. The Mayor so declared

An invitation was received from the Board of Trade of Glenwood Springs, inviting the City Council to attend a celebration at that place on April 27th on motion the invitation was accepted.
