May 5th 1891

City Council met in called session

Present Mayor J. M. Miller
Alderman M. F. Allison, C. C. Bower, E. W. Gannon, J. S. Hall, W. H. Lee & Geo. Ryan & D. P. Stetzelberger
and all the aldermen except D. W. Harris.

The committee on finance
then reported upon the petition referred to them at their last meeting
and D. P. Stetzelberger Chairman of Finance committee introduced
the following resolution to wit, That the City Clerk be instructed
to draw a warrant in favor of Mayor, J. M. Miller to the
amount of \$1666.⁶⁷ Said sum to be used for the purpose of
purchasing water rights or water certificates at the par value
of \$1666.⁶⁷ in the Mesa Co State Ditch. The vote being called on
the above resolution. The Alderman voted as follows

M. F. Allison No. J. S. Hall No. C. C. Bower, yes

E. W. Gannon yes. W. H. Lee yes. Geo. Ryan yes

D. P. Stetzelberger yes. Five Alderman having voted in the
affirmative, the resolution was adopted. A communication
was read from the P. O. S of A, asking that a committee of three
be appointed to confer with them and make arrangements for
the 4th of July celebration. The Mayor appointed as such com,
E. W. Gannon, C. C. Bower and Geo. Ryan. The subject of
sprinkling the streets was discussed and referred to the com.
on streets and alleys. City Marshal Geo. R. Barton spoke of
a log cabin on lower Main St, that at times was occupied
by tramps. The matter was referred to the com. on fire.

On motion the City Council then adjourned
