

Grand Junction, Colorado Sept 14<sup>th</sup> 1891

The City Council convened in regular session at 9 o'clock A.M.  
Present, C. C. Bower, E. W. Gannon, W. H. Lee, L. W. Norris, D. P. Stiegel-berger, J. G. Hall and George Ryan. In the absence of the Mayor E. W. Gannon president of the Board presided

Minutes of the regular meeting for August 10<sup>th</sup> 1891 were read, corrected and approved. Minutes of special meetings August 11 August 12 and August 14 were read and approved.

On motion it was ordered that an assistant janitor be allowed for the City Hall for two days Sept 15 and Sept 16 1891 at \$2<sup>50</sup> per day.

A Petition from the Grand Junction Street Car Co asking permission to run a steam locomotive along their track on Main street to the Hotel Brunswick was read. On motion said permission was granted for five days from Tuesday September 15<sup>th</sup> to Saturday September 19<sup>th</sup> 1891 inclusive.
