

Grand Junction Colorado Oct 12" 1891

The City Council met pursuant to adjournment.

Present Mayor L. M. Miller, Alderman C. C. Bower, J. G. Hall, W. H. Lee, L. H. Norris, Geo. Ryan and T. P. Stetzelberger.

The minutes for the regular meeting for September 14th and special meetings for Sept 31, Sept 25, and Sept 26 were read and approved

The Finance committee reported that the reports of the city officers for the month of September 1891 had been examined and found correct. Also that the committee had let the contract for the publication of the ordinances to the Grand Junction Star it being the lowest bidder.

On motion the report of the committee was accepted.

The committee on streets and alleys was granted further time in the matter of the opening of Main street.

A petition of T. D. Henderson to erect a tent on the corner of Main and Fifth streets was read and referred to the committee on fire and water.

A petition of L. F. Gerhardt et al for a side walk on the north side of Blocks 106 and 107 was read and referred to the committee on streets and alleys.

Job Payne presented a petition for a saloon on the South West corner of Block 142, corner of Second and Pitkin streets, which was read to the Committee on License. On motion the petition was allowed and the Clerk was instructed to issue a license upon the filing and approval of the proper bond.

Applications and bonds for saloon licenses were presented by Leshor & Crosby, Cosgrove and Ryan, Fredericks and Purcell, Fred W. Cobb and M. T. Devreux.

On motion the bonds were all approved with the exception of that of M. T. Devreux which was referred to the Committee on License

Ordinance No 22 being an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Con-

earing the Published book of ordinances was then read, and upon motion said ordinance was passed and adopted, the yeas and nays having been called and recorded with the following result: C. C. Bower yea, J. G. Hall yea, W. H. Lee yea, L. W. Norris yea, Geo Ryan yea, D. P. Stetzelberger yea.

On motion it was ordered that the Street Commissioner be instructed to at once shut the water off from the streets of the city.

The resignation of Eugene Bell as janitor of the City Hall was presented and on motion was accepted

The matter of filling the vacancy caused by the resignation of the janitor was referred to the committee on fire and water with power to act. ^{at the next regular meeting of the City Council} The following bids were received for the publication of the revised Ordinances in book form.

From the Grand Junction Star for 300 copies \$ 227.⁵⁰ for 500 copies \$ 269.⁰⁰
From the Grand Junction News for 300 copies \$ 238.²⁵ for 500 copies \$ 277.⁵⁰

On motion it was ordered that the Finance Committee be instructed to have 300 copies printed by the Lowest bidder.
