

Grand Junction Colo. November 10th A.D. 1891.

City Council met pursuant to adjournment. Present - A. Lobergren, M. J. Allison, E. W. Cannon, W. H. Lee, C. W. Norris and J. S. Wall, ^{Mayor, M. J. Allison being absent, President, E. W. Cannon organized the chair, Minutes of regular and special meeting of City Council held October 12th, were read and approved, a set of rules and regulations, for the government of the City Council were read and on motion adopted. On motion the regular order of business were suspended, and a committee consisting of A. J. McBurne, W. B. White and C. F. Carwell were heard on the subject of the City appropriating money for the benefit of Beach clay, after some discussion, The Clerk was on motion instructed to draw a warrant for \$350.00 in favor of C. F. Carwell, to pay bills incurred by the above named committee on Beach clay. The roll being called with the following vote, M. J. Allison yes, E. W. Cannon yes, W. H. Lee no, C. W. Norris yes, J. S. Wall no. Petitions. A petition for a side-walk signed by Geo. S. Currie et al was read and on motion referred to the committee on streets and alleys.}

A petition for an Arch light to be placed at the crossing of Pittkin & 4th Streets, signed by A. T. Wharton et al. was read and on motion referred to the committee on lights

Reports of City Officers.

B. E. Reagan, City Marshal, made his report for month of October which was on motion adopted,

J. F. Byers, Chief of Fire department, made a general report which was on motion laid on the table,

Frank H. Haskell, City Treasurer, made his report for the month of October which was referred to the committee on Finance.

Standing committees. The Finance committee reported that they had examined the City Treasurers report for month of Sept, and found same correct, Committee on Firens reported that they had examined the bonds of M. J. Demary and J. C. Payne, and found the securities sufficient; on motion the report of the committee was adopted, and the bonds approved.

A bill of W. T. Carpenter for coal furnished at City hall amounting to \$14.00 was on motion referred to the City Clerk, With instructions that said Clerk investigate the bill

On motion the bill of J. W. Bunting and all special Policeman, were referred back to be O. H. by the proper persons.
