City Council met pursuant to adjournment, Present, Mayor L. M. Miller, Aldermen C. C. Bower, E. W. Gannon, W. H. Lee, J. W. Norris, J. S. Hall and Sev. Ryan, The following resolution was then offered and on motion adopted, the yeas and nays having been called with the following result
C. C. Bower yea E. W. Gannon yea. W. H. Lee yea. J. W. Norris yea
J. S. Hall yea and Sev. Ryan yea, namely.

"whereas in the opinion of a two-thirds majority of the City Council it is necessary that a new sidewalk be constructed in front of the following described lots and parcels of land to wit; the south side of lot 20 and lots 21 to 30 inclusive in block no 127;

The South side of lot one, and lots 20 to 28 inclusive in block no 128;
 The South side of lot 20 and lots 21 to 30 inclusive in block no 138;
 lots 17 to 32 inclusive in block 85; lots 17 to 32 inclusive in block 84;
 the South side of lot one, and lots 20 to 28 inclusive in block 104;
 lots 17 to 32 inclusive in block 57. The North side of lot 10, and lots
 11 to 19 inclusive in block 106; lots 1 to sixteen inclusive
 in block 107; lots 1 to 16 inclusive in block 59;
 the West side of lot 32 in block 52; lots 17 to 32 inclusive in
 block 86; lots 20 and 21 in block 104; lots 1, 2, 7, and 8 in block
 144; lot 1 in block 11, in Richard D. Mobleys subdivision, and
 lots 17 to 20 inclusive in block 85.

I therefore be it ordered that a side-walk such as described
 by ordinance save and except that it shall be four (4) feet
 wide instead of (12) twelve feet wide, and laid upon three
 stringers the outside ones, to be not more than two inches
 from the outside edges of said side-walk, be constructed in
 front of and along. The South side of lot 20 and lots 21 to 30 inclusive
 in block 127; the South side of lot 1 and lots 20 to 28 inclusive
 in block 128; The south side of lot 20 and 21 to 30 inclusive
 in block 138; lots 17 to 32 inclusive in block 85; lots 17 to 32
 inclusive in block 86; lots 17 to 32 inclusive in block 57;
 lots 1 to 16 inclusive in block 59; The West side of lot 32 in block 52;
 lots 17 to 32 inclusive in block 86; lots 1, 2, 7 and 8 in block 144;
 lot one in block 11 in Richard D. Mobleys subdivision, and
 lots 17 to 20 inclusive in block 85;

And that a side-walk
 such as described by ordinance, save and except that it
 shall be six feet wide, instead of twelve feet wide; be
 constructed along and in front of; ^{the most upper of} lots 10 and lots 11 to
 19 inclusive in block one hundred and six; lots 1 to 16 inclusive
 in block 107; and ^{the South side of} lots 1 and lots 20 to 28 inclusive in
 block 106;

And that a side-walk such as
 described by ordinance be constructed in front of lots 20
 and 21 in block 104, all of said walk to be constructed
 under the provision of the ordinance concerning side-walks "

The bond of Gail C. Murray, for Saloon License, was
 examined and on motion approved. A petition from Matt J. and
 asking permission to rent one third of cedar under City hall building
 was read and on motion denied. (Charges were preferred
 against Policeman James Collins, which on motion was
 laid over until the next regular meeting. The Finance committee
 reported that they had examined the report of City Treasurer
 Frank H. Haskell for month of October and found the same
 correct; which on motion was adopted and ordered filed.
