

Grand Junction Colorado

April 18th A. D. 1892

City Council met pursuant to adjournment. Present Mayor L. M. Miller. Aldermen C. C. Bower Jas. S. Hall W. H. Lee, D. P. Stetzelberger, A. H. Wadsworth, A. J. McBurns M. L. Roberts and A. N. Anderson. City Council proceeded at once to the election of officers for the ensuing year. Mayor L. M. Miller appointed C. C. Bower and Jas. S. Hall as tellers.

C. C. Bower made a motion that the City Council go into executive session, motion carried. In the election of the officers of the City for the ensuing year, the members of the City Council voting were Mayor L. M. Miller. Aldermen C. C. Bower, J. S. Hall W. H. Lee, D. P. Stetzelberger A. H. Wadsworth, A. J. McBurns, M. L. Roberts, & A. N. Anderson.

Council then proceeded to the election of a President of the City Council for the ensuing year.

D. P. Stetzelberger received 6 votes, and A. J. McBurns 3 votes. D. P. Stetzelberger having received a majority of all the votes cast was declared duly elected President of the Council for the ensuing year.

City Council then proceeded to the election of a City Marshal, with the following result: B. F. Reagan 5 votes and M. F. Fredricks 4 votes. B. F. Reagan having received a majority of all the votes cast was declared duly elected City Marshal.

City Council then proceeded to the election of a City Attorney with the following result: S. N. Wheeler 5 votes, Wallaro 3 votes and Holman 1 vote. S. N. Wheeler having received a majority of all the votes cast was declared duly elected City Attorney.

City Council then proceeded to the election of a Street Commissioner, with the following result: Felix Toupin 5 votes and James Whitley 4 votes. Felix Toupin having received a majority of all the votes cast was declared duly elected Street Commissioner.

City Council then proceeded to the election of a City Clerk with the following result: B. F. Jay received 9 votes, being all the votes cast he was declared duly elected City Clerk.

City Council then proceeded to the election of a City Surveyor with the following result: D. K. Crosby received 9 votes, being all the votes cast he was declared duly elected City Surveyor.

City Council then proceeded to the election of a Policeman with the following result: M. F. Fredricks 6 votes Fred Halbour 3 votes M. F. Fredricks having received a majority of all the votes cast was declared duly elected Policeman. A motion was made and carried that the City Clerk notify Police Judge S. S. McMillen to file a sufficient bond in the sum of \$2000.

D. P. Stetzelberger introduced the following resolution Resolved, That the resolution passed by the Board of Aldermen at their meeting Tuesday April 12th 1892, relating to the annulling of the Grand Junction Water Works Co's Franchise and contract with the City

a copy of which is presented with this resolution be and it is hereby recinded
a motion was made and carried that the resolution lay over until
the next meeting of the City Council.

On motion City Council adjourned
