

Grand Junction Colorado

June 14th A. D. 1892

City Council met in regular session. Present Mayor  
L. M. Miller. Aldermen C. C. Bower, J. S. Hall  
W. H. Lee, D. P. Metzgerberger, M. L. Roberts and A. N. Anderson

Minutes of regular meeting held May 10th was read and  
approved. A petition from John Shields, asking permission to  
erect a wooden building within the fire limits was rejected

Reports of City Treasurer, City Marshal and Police Judge, <sup>for month of May</sup> read  
and referred to Finance Committee

Licenses committee to whom had been referred the Road of J. P. Payne  
and David Carr, for Saloon License, recommended that the same  
be approved, on motion the report of the committee was adopted.

Finance Committee reported that they had examined the  
reports of the City Treasurer, Police Magistrate, City Marshal for month of  
April and found same correct; on motion the report of the committee  
was adopted.

On motion the City Clerk was instructed to  
purchase and have put upon the door to the Police court room  
a lock, also to provide the necessary legal blanks for the Police  
Court;

Com. on Health reported that they had rented two  
lots from the Town-Co. near the Electric Light Plant, for \$50.00  
per annum, for City Pond, on motion the action of the Com.  
was approved

On motion an old frame barn or stable  
at S. W. Corner of the old Board of Trade building, <sup>condemned and</sup> was ordered  
torn down at the expense of the owner.

on motion the City  
Marshal was instructed to see the owners of those old buildings  
that had been removed from the present site of the Cannon Block  
to other places temporarily, and to have the same torn down or  
removed within 90 days

A petition for the opening of Main  
Street to the river was read and referred to the committee on streets  
and Alleys with instructions to report at next meeting of the  
Council,

The question of Opera house license was discussed  
and the com. on Licenses was given further time

Mayor L. M. Miller called the attention of the Council  
to the fact that impure milk was being sold in Grand Junction,  
and on motion the subject was referred to the com. on Health  
with power to act;

On motion the City Clerk was instructed  
to notify all Lumbermen to put in bids. for furnishing the  
City with Lumber for the ensuing year

By a unanimous vote of the City Council, The Marshal was instructed to enforce the ordinance relative to Saloon closing on Sunday, The question grading 5th St. to the Bridge was referred to the com. on Street and alleys, with instructions to have some definite plans prepared to submit at the next meeting of the City Council.

On motion bill of H. F. Sitters as special constable on election day for \$5.00 was disallowed, Bill of J. L. Bartow for \$18.05 was referred to Finance com. The following bills were read and on motion allowed, and the clerk instructed to draw warrants for same.
