

## Grand Junction Cole.

June 21st. 7, 30 P. M. D. D. 1892

City Council met pursuant to adjournment. Present  
 Mayor L. M. Miller, Aldermen. W. H. Lee, Jas. S. Hall  
 D. P. Metzberger, A. K. Wadsworth and A. R. Anderson

A. K. Wadsworth, Chairman Com. on Streets & Alleys  
 Reported, that he had spent some time in looking up the subject  
 of grading 5th St to the Bridge and the opening of Main St to the  
 River, but had no definite report to make.

W. H. Lee, Chairman Com. on License reported that, Alderman  
 Anderson a member of the committee favored making the  
 license on Opera Houses \$50.<sup>00</sup> per annum, While he was  
 in favor of it remaining as it was. Alderman Metzberger  
 made a motion that the License of Opera Houses be \$50.<sup>00</sup> per annum  
 payable semiannually, Alderman Wadsworth, offered an  
 amendment to the original motion, that the license be  
 \$100.<sup>00</sup> per annum, The original motion as amended was  
 carried.

A contract for electric lights between the City  
 of Grand Junction and the Electric Mfg. Co. was read and  
 approved.

City Surveyor, Crosby reported that by careful  
 survey of Block 83 he found the fence constructed along the East-  
 side of lot 22 in said block to be 1,3 ft in the Alley

On motion the report was adopted and the Street Commission  
 instructed to take down the fence.

City Surveyor, Crosby further  
 reported that the Limestone monuments on Lower 7th St were  
 out of place, whereupon a motion was made and carried  
 authorizing the City Engineer to place the said monuments in  
 their proper places.
