

Grand Junction, Colorado

Sept. 16th A.D. 1892

City Council met according to adjournment.
Present: D. P. Stetzelberger President of the Council,
Aldermen C. C. Bower W. H. Lee J. G. Hall
A. R. Wadsworth and A. N. Anderson.

Reports of City Treasurer, Police Judge and City Marshal for month of Aug. were read and referred to the Finance com. Report of City Clerk for five months ending Aug. 31st, was read and referred to Finance committee. Report of City Engineer was read and on motion adopted.

The Saloon License of Fred W. Cobb was on motion transferred from the said Fred W. Cobb, to the Firm of Cobb & Dulmaine.

On motion the board of George Flehner, for a Plumbers License, was approved, and the Clerk instructed to issue said license.

Two Side-walk petitions were read and referred to Committee on Streets and Alleys. A petition asking for a reduction in Saloon License was read and on motion referred to the committee on License.

A new ordinance on the subject of licenses for Opera Houses &c. was presented by the City Attorney, and after some discussion was on motion laid over one week.

The following resolution was unanimously adopted. Whereas, certain frame buildings situated on lots (1) Block 118, Lots 17, 4 & 10 in Block 119, in the City of Grand Junction, are situated within the fire limits of said City, and

Whereas, said buildings are not constructed as required by Ordinance No 6, of the Revised Ordinances of 1891, of the City of Grand Junction, and Whereas, said buildings, on account of the proximity of other buildings, and on account of defective structure are unsafe and dangerous to the property in the same vicinity where said buildings are situated, and dangerous to property in the City of Grand Junction generally.

Be it Resolved, by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction in regular session, that the said buildings and each of the same are hereby declared to be a nuisance and the City Marshal of the City of Grand Junction is hereby ordered to immediately serve notice upon the owners of said buildings to move the same within forty-eight hours herefrom, to some point outside the fire limits of said City.
