City Council met in Special Session.

Present Mayor L. M. Miller. Aldermen W. H. Lee, J. S. Hall, A. J. McCune, M. L. Roberts, D. P. Stetzelberger, A. K. Wadsworth and A. N. Anderson.

Special committee appointed to purchase a hose cart, reported through their chairman D. P. Stetzelberger that a cart could be bought for \$125⁰⁰ ^{Cash}

Report of committee adopted, and cart ordered purchased.

On motion the City Marshal was instructed to purchase necessary amount of Lime to disinfect all Privy vaults within the City. The matter of cutting the weeds from the ditches was discussed and referred to the committee on Streets & Alleys

A. K. Wadsworth, Chairman of Committee on Streets & Alleys, Reported and recommended that the principal Street to the depot be gravelled, on motion the report was adopted.

On motion, in answer to a petition of length signed by many leading citizens, the City Clerk was instructed to draw a warrant to the amount of \$500⁰⁰ in favor of A. K. Wadsworth, for the purpose of improving certain streets near the Depot;

The yeas and nays being called upon the above motion with the following result; D. P. Stetzelberger yeas, M. L. Roberts yeas, J. S. Hall No, W. H. Lee No, A. K. Wadsworth, yeas, A. J. McCune yeas, and A. N. Anderson yeas. Mayor L. M. Miller appointed

D. P. Stetzelberger, auditing committee upon the expenditure of the \$500⁰⁰ appropriated to be expended upon certain streets.

M. Strouse, appeared before the City Council, and protested against the removal of his building, as per former order of the City Council. On motion the matter was laid over until next regular meeting of the City Council

On motion Council adjourned.
